Everest from base camp. But that's where the likeness ends. This is a document accessible to any adult interested in his or her faith. And it deserves to be read thoroughly at a reflective pace. It also needs to be weighed carefully in light of St. John Paul II's Familiaris Consortio, the theology of the body, and other preceding Church documents on marriage and the family."





We are currently at 61% of our \$65,364 goal with a total of \$39,812 from 241 donors. Compared to last year's appeal, we are ahead of our contributions with fewer donors.
