The Easter Vigil each year is the first celebration of the Resurrection and is the most important liturgy of the year since the whole of our faith is built upon this central belief: Jesus is risen from the dead! It begins with ...

THE BLESSING OF THE FIRE AND PREPARATION OF THE CANDLE.

(Did you ever stop and think about the meaning of the Paschal candle and what it tells us about Jesus Christ?)

A large fire is prepared outside the church and the people and Priest assemble with others (carrying the Paschal candle). The Priest then greets the assembly and blesses the fire. As he traces the cross, the Greek letter Alpha above the cross and Omega below, and the numerals of the current year, he says the following:

*Christ yesterday and today; the Beginning and the End;
the Alpha; and the Omega.
All time belongs to him; and all the ages.
To him be glory and power;
Through every age and for ever. Amen*

Next the Priest inserts five grains of incense in the candle. He does this in the form of a cross saying:

*By his holy and glorious wounds,
may Christ the Lord guard us and protect us. Amen.*

The Priest lights the candle from the new fire, saying:

May the light of Christ rising in glory dispel the darkness of our hearts and minds.

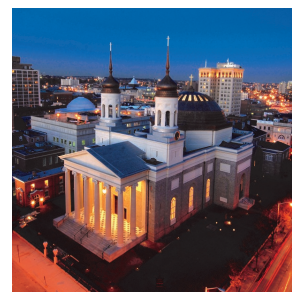
Then we enter the church and all candles are lit from the Paschal candle and the celebration begins!

The flame of the Paschal candle (also called the Easter candle) symbolizes Christ as the light of the world and *his presence in the midst of his people*. It is the presence of the Paschal Mystery: the Passion, Death and Resurrection of Jesus Christ. Because we are immersed in the that mystery, the candle is lit throughout the fifty days of Easter and at every funeral liturgy and celebration of Baptism.
