

The Twenty First Sunday



In Ordinary Time

Dear Friends.

As we gathered for the Twenty First Sunday in Ordinary Time we were reminded that through our Baptism God has invited us to the eternal kingdom. While the question that we heard in the Gospel is about how many will be saved, for us the better question could be “will I be saved?” Our life of faith and hope give us the confidence to answer “yes” to our desire for salvation. The answer however, is not expressed by our lips but rather through our acts of love. Let us prayer this week be that we receive the grace and the will to do what God requires of us in this life always with our eyes fixed on the eternal life to come!

This is the second week that we enjoyed entering our church through the narthex, which means gathering space. A narthex, in ancient times, was a courtyard where the faithful would assemble before entering the sacred space for worship. It was often the place with a water feature which would be used to baptize adults before they gathered with the worshipping community. The narthex was the place for conversation and fellowship. As you can now see, we have something that lends itself to just such gathering, conversation and fellowship. With this new gift, we have a new challenge.

The new challenge is simply this, that we keep the church proper as the SACRED SPACE FILLED WITH SILENCE. Over the years, and especially as we dealt with the challenges of construction, the church has become a very noisy place, prohibiting at times, meaningful silence where our brothers and sisters could communicate with the Lord and more importantly LISTEN to His Voice. We now have plenty of outdoor space with a canopy, benches to gather in the prayer garden, and a narthex with ample space for meaningful conversation and fellowship. We will be keeping the interior doors leading to church closed so that we will try to create the atmosphere of quiet in the church while people can still have the freedom to speak in the narthex. Please join me in a personal commitment to be conscious of the need for silence in church and to contribute in assuring that this happens for the sake of those who wish to prepare for Mass and for those who want to make a longer prayer of thanksgiving after the celebration. Together we can grow in our efforts to insure an atmosphere for prayer in our beautiful church.

Next weekend we will welcome Father Jose Jacob, SMM who will speak to us about the needs of the Diocese of Daru-Kiunga in Papua, New Guinea. The Mission Cooperative Plan Collection will be the second collection next Sunday to support this diocese. Thank you in advance for your generosity!

We are rapidly approaching the beginning of the academic year for all of our parish students in university, high school, middle school, grade school and early childhood levels. We wish them much success as they begin again and assure them of our prayerful support as they develop their God-given gifts and talents moving forward, always forward!

I will be away from the parish for the next two weeks. I leave you in the competent care of Father Biedrzycki. Be gentle with him, it is his first attempt at the helm! See all of you real soon!




THE ROMAN CATHOLIC DIOCESE OF DARU-KIUNGA

SERVING THE WESTERN PROVINCE OF PAPUA NEW GUINEA

The country of Papua New Guinea is a cluster of islands located south of the equator to the north of Australia and to the east of Indonesia. The Diocese of Daru-Kiunga is one of the 19 Catholic dioceses in this country and covers the entire state of Western Province. The geography of this massive area of approximately 42,000 sq. miles is most challenging: swamps, lakes, rivers and mountains most of which are dense tropical forests cover the area. As the country is close to the equator it is very hot and humid throughout the year.

The tribal people, of Melanesian race, came in contact with the external world when Montfort Missionaries from Canada arrived in the late 1950's. Since then the Church in this remote and undeveloped part of the world has brought faith, health and education to the people. Today the Catholic population is around 40,000 and makes up approximately 40% of the total population of the state.

The church began its work in the remote villages by establishing schools and primary health clinics which have brought considerable improvement in the quality of life of the people. To this day it is the diocese that provides basic health and educational needs of the people, in the absence of such services from the government. The area has few transportation facilities and depends on small planes to transport essential medical supplies and other necessities. In the absence of telephones, electricity and roads our only means of communication between parishes and the diocesan headquarters is two way radios.

A very vibrant and energetic Church has emerged here over the past 55 years due to the hard work of the innumerable missionaries, some of whom have given their entire working years in the service of these simple, yet happy and welcoming people. Having emerged in the post Vatican period, the diocese promotes the Spirituality of Communion among all its faithful thus involving them in the decision making from the grass roots level.

One of the main challenges before the diocese is to raise enough funds to continue all these services in the formation of faith as well as other humanitarian and developmental activities. It is with the help of Catholics from Canada, the United States and Germany that the diocese has been able to accomplish so much over these years.

Through the mission appeal during the weekend August 27th and 28th, we invite the parishioners of St. Robert Bellarmine to join us in bringing the message of Jesus to the people of Western Province in Papua New Guinea. Fr. Jacob will preach at St. Robert Bellarmine.
