



On December 31, 2014, 23 pieces of Pennsylvania State legislation were enacted that impact the way we prevent and report child abuse. As a result, all people who volunteer for the Archdiocese of Philadelphia are required fulfill the following obligations:

- ◆ Federal History Fingerprint Clearance ~ ONLY if you lived outside of PA within the last 10 years





Food for thought for families —Passing on a Living Faith!

The Catholic Church calls the family the 'domestic Church.' The family is a community and the most basic way in which the Lord gathers us. As families you carry out the mission of the Church in your home in ordinary ways when:



You believe in God and that God cares about you, in good times and bad.

You love and respect others. Children form a picture of God from the love they experience among their relatives and godparents.

You foster intimacy. To share oneself and be accepted within a family is indispensable to forming a close relationship with the Lord.

You evangelize by professing faith in God, acting in accord with Gospel values and setting an example of Christian living for your children and others.

You educate, especially by example. Sometimes children listen and learn; sometimes they teach you. Your wisdom and theirs comes from the Spirit.

You pray together, thanking God for blessings, reaching for strength, asking for guidance in crisis and doubt. God answers all prayers, but sometimes in surprising ways.

You serve one another, sacrificing your own wants for the other's good. Your "deaths" and "risings" become compelling signs of Jesus' own life, death and resurrection.

You forgive and seek reconciliation. When you do so, family members come to believe that, no matter what, they are still loved by you and by God.

You celebrate life, whether for birthdays, weddings, births, deaths, first day or school or graduation, new jobs, old friends, family reunions, holy days and holidays. You come together when tragedy strikes or in joyful celebration of the sacraments. As you gather for a meal, you break bread and share stories, becoming more fully the community of love that Jesus call us to be.

You welcome the stranger, the lonely one, the grieving person into your home. You give drink to the thirsty and food to the hungry. The gospel assures us that we do this, they are strangers no more, but Christ.

You act justly in your community when you treat others with respect, stand against discrimination and racism, and work to overcome hunger, poverty, homelessness, illiteracy.

You affirm life as a precious gift from God. You oppose whatever destroys life, such as abortion, euthanasia, capital punishment, neighborhood and domestic violence, poverty and racism. Within your family, you make peace.

You raise up vocations to the priesthood and religious life. This is especially fostered through family prayer, involvement in parish life, and by the way you speak of priests, sisters, brothers and permanent deacons.

None of the above is done perfectly in any family! However the Lord works through us all. It is good to remember: "... a family is holy, not because it is perfect, but because God's grace is at work in it, helping it to set out anew everyday on the way of love." (Follow the Way of Love, US Bishop Statement on the Family)


1) The official hymn of the 2015 World **Meeting of Families is "Sound the Bell of Holy**
