The Nineteenth Sunday



In Ordinary Time

On this, the Nineteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time, we gathered in God's presence to be reminded once again whose people we are, and to whom we belong. Our Lord Jesus urged us in the Gospel to make ourselves ready for the Master's return, for we do not know when it will happen. To always live in right relationship with the Lord rids ourselves of the fear of death. To live in the state of grace allows us to journey in confidence that we are the Lord's and He is ours. During these summer days, perhaps a good confession will bring all of us the peace of mind we need, knowing not the time nor the hour of the Lord's visitation and our call home!

It is so hard to believe that we are already a week into the month of August. Our school children will be returning to school before this month's end. I pray that it has been a good summer for all of you. I can see from the weekend crowds that many of our parishioners have been away for some well deserved rest and relaxation. I continue to be grateful to those many parishioners who have been generously "making up" for the Sunday collections for which they have been away. This is very helpful for our budget and billings, which never take a vacation. Many thanks for all that you do to help with the necessary expenses throughout the year.

You should be receiving shortly the annual fall letter and census information card with the customary contribution envelope. This is very important for several reasons. First, we need to provide to the archdiocese our census information annually. It is important that this is as accurate as possible. Many decisions on an archdiocesan level are made in light of the statistics that they have at their disposal. Our records need to reflect who we truly are. Unfortunately, more than a few of our parish families ignore this request. As a result, we have some inaccurate data being provided to the archdiocese. Please make every effort to complete the information or simply check "no change" on the census form. Secondly, the fall collection is one of the three major collections which sponsor the good works of the parish and assist the community in meeting its fiscal responsibilities. I know that many of our senior citizens are on fixed incomes so meeting the requested amount is not possible. I understand that without question. I firmly believe that if everyone did a little, much would be gained. Thank you in advance with whatever you can do.

Also, on the topic of the census, I ask families to indicate on the census card ONLY those who reside PERMANENTLY at the address. Exceptions can be made if a child is away at college. An adult child who is living away from the home, and not for educational purposes, should not be listed as a resident. Adult Catholics living at another address should be registered where they reside. Please keep this in mind when completing the census form. Again, accuracy is our goal!

This August 15th, the Solemnity of the Assumption, is NOT a Holyday of Obligation since it falls on a Monday. The Mass for this Solemnity will be celebrated at 8:00 AM in church. There will be no additional Masses that day.

As I write this, it is my hope that we are now using our new entrance to church. If not, please know that I am as disappointed as you! This project has been a great occasion for the practice of the virtue of patience for all of us. May the joy of completion be ours today!

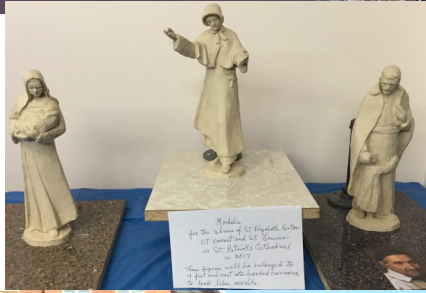
Day 3 of our Pilgrimage/Mission/Youth Conference Trip

HONOR RIDE PHILADELPHIA GETS READY TO ROLL ON SEPT. 18

Ride 2 Recovery Invites the Public to Join Healing Heroes on Bikes – Registration is open for the upcoming Honor Ride Philadelphia, which will take place this year on Sunday, September 18. Cyclists are encouraged join America’s healing heroes to raise funds and create awareness for Ride 2 Recovery, www.ride2recovery.com, a unique, ground-breaking rehabilitation program for injured veterans.



Riders of all ages and levels will meet at the Horsham Air Guard Station in Horsham, PA. There will be three separate routes to choose from: 20 miles, 40 miles and 60 miles. The Honor Ride Philadelphia is a self-paced, non-competitive cycling event.

All funds raised through Honor Ride Philadelphia support Ride 2 Recovery’s veteran’s rehabilitation and recovery program called Project HERO in Philadelphia. There is no cost to veterans to use this program which has proven results enhancing both mental and physical health and wellness of our healing heroes.

“Almost anyone can ride a bike,” said Todd Setter, SVP, Events. “These rides are fun and non-competitive. They bring people from all communities together to make a difference. They not only raise funds, but they raise awareness for our veterans recovering from combat related injuries.”

The Honor Ride starts at 8:00am (registration begins at 6:45am) with pre-ride festivities beginning at 7:30am. Registration is \$75 until Friday, September 17 at 8pm. Day of the ride, registration is \$85. Riders can get a \$20 discount if they register by June 17.

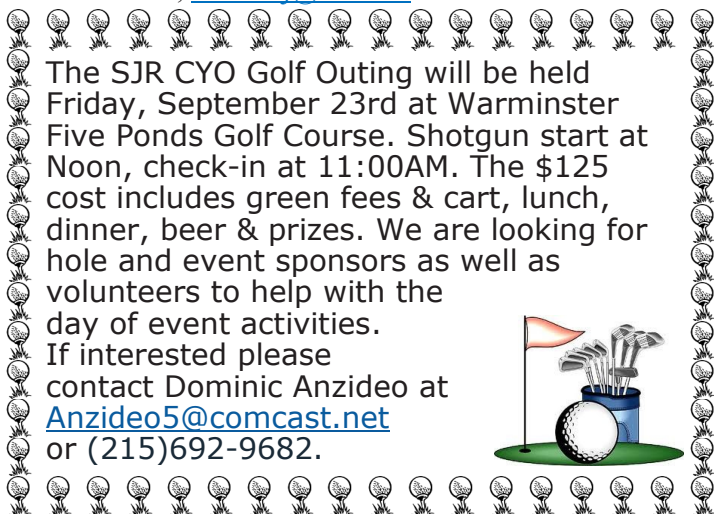

You must be a registered member of the Parish and must notify the priest **at least six months** prior to your marriage date. Visit the parish website for detailed information **Pre-Cana classes (2nd Sat. in March. & 2nd Sat. in November) are required.** Contact Parish Office or visit the parish website for registration forms. Forms are due 2 weeks prior to the Pre-Cana Class.

SACRAMENT OF THE SICK

Available to those who are preparing for surgery, sick, elderly or dying. Please contact the parish office to receive this sacrament.

EUCCHARISTIC ADORATION

Adoration - **Each Monday (except Summer & National Holidays)** after the 9 am Mass, with simple Reposition (No Benediction) at 4 pm. **At 3 pm the Divine Mercy Chaplet is recited.**

COMMUNION CALLS

Monthly to homebound by the priests. Weekly - Extraordinary Ministers if requested. In an Emergency a Priest Should Be Called Immediately call parish office and dial 400.

Welcome new parishioners! Please ask one of the priests after a weekend Mass to register your family. Please notify the parish office if you are moving from the parish or if you have changed your address. Also, Children who turn 26 years of age, or have completed higher education and continue to reside with in our area, should become individually registered parishioners.
