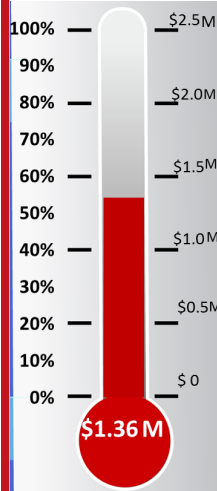

# The Nineteenth Sunday

Dear Friends,

On this Nineteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time, Saint Paul had an important message for us when we heard – “All bitterness, fury, anger, shouting, and rivaling must be removed from you.” These are powerful words, which when removed from our individual faith journey, can bring a sense of community and peace. During these days of summer reflection and easier pace, let us look into our loves to see what we can rid that will bring unity and peace to those with whom we live, work and play each day.

As was announced at all the Masses last weekend, there has been a change in our parish’s participation in the Missionary Cooperation Program this month. Due to an unforeseen commitment on the part of our speaker, Brother Francis Eells, a De LaSalle Christian Brother, the talk and collection has now been moved to **the weekend of August 15/16**. Brother Eells will speak at all the Masses and the **second collection that weekend will be in support of the work of the De LaSalle Christian Brothers**. I thank you in advance for your participation in this worthy cause for the spread of the Gospel through the missionary work of this religious community. By the way, Brother Eells graduated from Saint Joseph/Saint Robert School and was a parishioner of Saint Joseph Parish in Warrington where his parents still reside. It will be like a homecoming of sorts to have Brother here with us in Warrington that weekend.

We will continue to try to keep you informed of what is scheduled to take place from week to week. This coming week we are anticipating the installation of the new gas lines, water lines and electrical conduit, the concrete pads for the new air conditioning units for the church as well as the footers for the retaining walls around the units. Also, because of the new air conditioning for church, the soffits in church need to be taken down and new duct work installed. Things will be busy this week and things will get dirty and dusty, but all for a good cause!

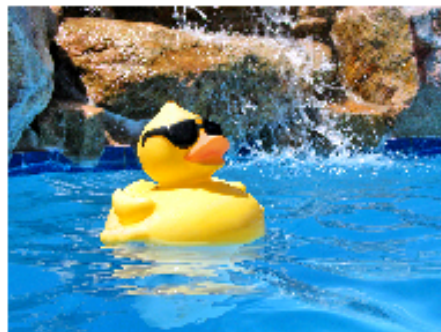

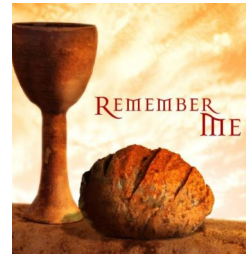

## FOCUS ON FAITH

## NINETEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

1 Kings 19: 4-8; Ephesians 4: 30—5:2; John 6: 41-51

*Jesus, abundantly poured out in the Eucharist, be multiplied in my life  
so that I can reach out to the needs of others*



**Singing the Communion Song — Part III (last):**

**To make the communal nature of the Communion procession more evident**

This third purpose is two-pronged. On one hand, the song is to direct our attention outward toward the communal celebration rather than inward to private prayer. That means that songs which speak of adoration of the Blessed Sacrament (songs proper to Benediction and to times of Eucharistic Adoration) should not be used at this time. Suitable songs have texts which speak of our being brought together as the one **Body of Christ**, as the community of the Church, and/or of our mission to be the Body of Christ in the world.

Secondly, the song needs to support our procession to and from the Eucharistic table. The procession is itself symbolic of what is taking place: all of us—the able and lame, the ready and the not-so-ready, the healed and those in need of healing—march together to the table of the Lord to celebrate the fullness of our redemption in Christ as one Body. The singing is how we engage our hearts with our bodies in this important processional movement, to and from the altar. More than any other activity at this moment in the Mass, our singing together is perhaps the one which most effectively draws us out of our separate worlds into our shared identity as the Body of Christ. **Taste and see**

***the goodness of the Lord.* (Psalm 34)**

### ***THEME FOR AUGUST — Choosing Life***

We began this catechesis by explaining that God made us for a reason. The God we meet in Jesus Christ loves us, and calls us to love as he does. Marriage is the sacrament that brings human fertility into this mission of love. If we understand that love is our mission in our marriages, families, and parishes, then we have learned a basic truth that will shape many other areas of life. For example, if fidelity to the covenant requires restraint and perseverance, if our bodies and the material world can be vessels of divine grace, then we can approach questions of sexuality, ecology, technology, and medicine with renewed commitment and insight. We now realize why a catechesis on the family has actually been a catechesis for all of life. If we have learned to think of our families as domestic churches, if we have learned why moral individualism is not the right context for receiving Catholic teaching, then we have adopted a view that will reorient our whole identity. This mission is not reserved for the few or for the extraordinary. Nor does it mean that families somehow have to stop being themselves or seek after some impossible perfection in order to witness to the Gospel. It may mean that we are sometimes minorities in a secular culture that sees life differently. But the Church has wide experience of many different cultural contexts, offering wisdom and advice about spiritual practices to sustain us. Please see the catechism for more details. Love is our origin and destiny, which is why only the way of love can truly satisfy, and that is why Love is Our Mission. - Christopher C. Roberts, catechism editor
