

Tuition Assistance for 2016/2017 – Submission Deadline Fast Approaching: December 31, 2015

It is very important that every SJR family review the new application process for tuition scholarship. Families can apply who have students enrolling in grades Pre-K through 12th. Families with one dependent must have an annual income of less than \$91,620. For each additional dependent, you can make an additional \$15,270 per child. If you qualify, it is strongly recommended that you apply. Through the generosity of businesses that have allocated their tax dollars to SJR, we were able to provide tuition assistance to 20 students for the 2015-2016 academic year.

SmartAid applications for tuition assistance are available. To apply, please visit: www.SmartAidForParents.com. The St. Joseph/St. Robert school code is 91062. You will need your most recent tax return and when available, you will need to submit documents related to your current year's income in January. If you did not qualify in 2014 and your income status has changed for 2015, you need to apply now with 2014 tax return and then forward 2015 tax return in January.


