First Sunday



Dear Friends,

On this first Sunday of Lent, Jesus enters the desert and invites us to do the same. During the next forty days, let us clear our minds and hearts and recall who our God is and whose we are. Our scripture readings of this Sunday assist us by recalling Moses' admonishment to the Israelites to recall all that God has done for them when they bring their offering to the Lord. Saint Paul added that "no one who believes in him will be put to shame." And Jesus, at the end of his desert experience, is ready to encounter the devil and his temptations. Lent is this time of reflection, inviting the Lord's grace into our lives with courage and commitment for a holier me!

The front cover of this bulletin lists the many avenues of grace, devotion and learning during this Lenten journey. Please post this in your homes and see it as an invitation to participate in this time of more intense prayer, mortification and charity. There is something for everyone! Please feel free to invite others to join us as well. Together may this be a time of maturing in the graces of the God of mercy!

As I announced at the Masses I celebrated last weekend, I received a letter from the Vocation Office for the Diocesan Priesthood informing me that another parishioner, MR. BENJAMIN SPERANZA, has been accepted by Archbishop Chaput to begin studies for the priesthood at Saint Charles Seminary in August, 2016. He will begin his studies as a First Collegian. I take this opportunity to congratulate Ben as well as his parents Mike and Christa and his brothers and sisters who have supported him in this discernment. Please continue to pray for an increase in vocations to the priesthood and consecrated life. We need many more young men and women to serve the Church and the world as priests and religious men and women.

I hope you are pleased with the progress we can now see for the new narthex to our church. It will truly be a welcoming space for all to gather and come together as the local parish family. The parish office center is also progressing nicely. It is our hope that the center will be open sometime in the beginning of March. Recently, the Facilities Committee met with Northampton Nursery to discuss the plans for the Prayer Garden which is a component of the entire project. Mr. Bill Horan and his brother Joe have presented the concept plan. The committee is very excited about the design and the planned gardens, trees and shrubs which will assist in creating this prayerful space. The Blessed Mother, which was on the northern wall of the original church, is currently being refurbished and will be a central figure in the garden. There are also tentative plans for the installation of the Stations of the Cross. These stations may be an opportunity to memorialize a loved one within the garden. More information on this will be forthcoming.

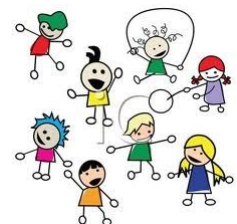
