First Sunday

Dear Friends,

On this First Sunday of Lent, we recall the twofold nature of the season. For catechumens, designated this week as the Elect, Lent is a time of final preparation for Baptism. For those of us already baptized, it is a time of repentance and renewal through the practices of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. For all of us, baptized and unbaptized alike, Lent is about our baptismal covenant with God - the promises that we have made and will make, rejecting Satan and professing our belief in God!

To assist everyone in his/her lenten journey of prayer, fasting and almsgiving, on the cover of this bulletin are the events of grace listed for your convenience. Please place the schedule in a prominent place in your home to serve as an invitation and reminder of the opportunities to grow closer to the Lord during these forty days. Perhaps, through the graces received at this time, we may have the courage to invite a non-practicing member of our family or community to once again join us in the journey of faith.

By January 31, 2015 we were required to submit to Archbishop Chaput the annual Parish Pastoral Report for our parish. This is a snapshot of who we are as a community, growing in faith and love for the Lord. Currently there are 2,296 families which make up our parish with 7,330 individual souls. We had 39 celebrations of Baptism with 92 members who received Confirmation and 93 members receiving their First Holy Communion. Twenty five couples entered the sacrament of Marriage last year. We celebrated the Sacrament of the Sick for 188 people and had funeral Masses in our church for 46 members. We are blessed to report that we have one member of our parish studying for the priesthood. The report also outlined the numerous opportunities that are provided for religious education for the children and adults in the parish. This section made me particularly proud since many communities do not offer these opportunities to the extent that we have here at Saint Robert's. Also, the report outlines the many opportunities that our community has for service and charity to others. When reviewing the report the one word that comes to mind is VIBRANT. This vitality is the practical work of countless people who participate and generously offer their time, talent and treasure to the Lord through this local community. THANK YOU for making this parish a wonderful place to gather together in faith to worship and praise the Lord for all the good he has done for us!

May this first full week of Lent be the beginning of great things experienced during these blessed forty days!




