Dear Friends.

In the middle of our Lenten journey, we come to celebrate a God who responds to our afflictions and gives us time to repent. In the scriptures, Moses encounters God in the burning bush, and Jesus tells of a patient God who will give us yet one more chance to repent and be fruitful. This week, let us be mindful of how we encounter God in our own lives. How is God patient with us? How do we respond to God's tender care in our lives? What room have we created to hear and respond to God's invitations?

When it is finished, I think we will all be happy with our new front door as we welcome all to worship the Lord!


