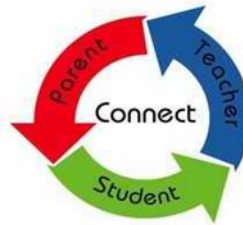

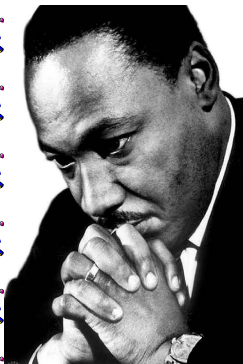

THE EPIPHANY OF OUR LORD

Isaiah 60:1-6; Ephesians 3:2-3a,5-6; Matthew 2:1-12

The Manifestation of Our God

The Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord embodies a rich liturgical tradition, originating in the earliest Christian centuries. In the Eastern Churches, this day occupies an even greater prominence than Christmas. Rome has assimilated it into the Christmas season where too often the faithful understand it to be only a commemoration of the visit of the Magi to the newborn Christ.



The account of the Magi is indeed a rich and beautiful story that shows well the virtues—and perils—of seeking Christ. However, this Solemnity reveals so much more to us! Taken together, the Gospel accounts of the Magi, the baptism of Jesus in the Jordan, and his first sign (or miracle) at the wedding feast at Cana, draw our attention to the depth of God's profound saving love for us in Christ, a love which extends to the ends of the Earth!

At we enter the new year, what gift do you bring to the Lord? How will this gift bring others closer to Jesus?

*Almighty Father, you revealed Jesus as the light of the nations, the eternal Word made flesh.
Bathe us in his light and draw us beyond our human limits into the completeness of your life.*

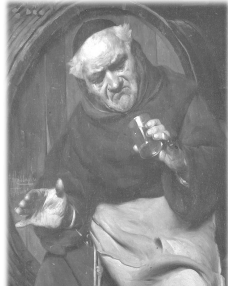

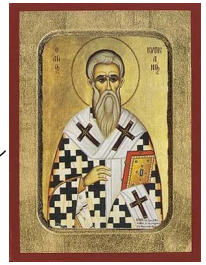

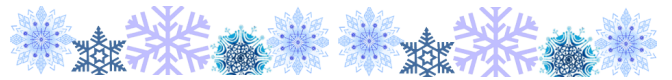
