The Second Sunday

Dear Friends.

Today, with the celebration of the Second Sunday in Ordinary Time, we will begin a two month stretch of Sundays in Ordinary Time. Except for today, all the Sunday *Gospels will be from Saint Matthew, and all, including today, will be about Jesus' early* public ministry. As a matter of fact, all of the readings for this Sunday are about the mission that God has for those who follow God. Isaiah spoke of being God's servant, Saint Paul said he was called to be an apostle; and John the Baptist, himself a servant of God, identified Jesus as the Son of God. May we live each day of this week practicing what we responded to at the Mass and make it our daily prayer: "Here am I, Lord; I come to do vour will."

This Monday we recognize the contributions of Doctor Martin Luther King. Jr and his work on behalf of civil rights. It has become, for many, a day of community service. As *Christians, we mark this day and are reminded that every day our faith calls us to be of* service to the needs of those who surround us.

In Ordinary Time *I recently received a letter from Archbishop Chaput concerning the upcoming* Catholic Charities Appeal. Bill Fehrman and I will be attending a meeting this week concerning this annual appeal. In the letter we have been notified that our goal will increase this year by 10%. I will share with you some additional information as we draw closer to the kick-off. Thank you for all that you did last year to meet and surpass our parish goal! Your generosity on behalf of the poor is indeed edifying!

Next Saturday we will celebrate the Sacrament of Penance for the first time with our parish third grade students. This is a wonderful time to be reminded of the beauty of the Lord's mercy dramatically celebrated in this sacrament. Please pray for our young children that their experience of this encounter will be the beginning of a healthy and consistent plea for the Lord's *mercy and peace!*

During the first week of January, we have concluded the construction contracts with both CH&E and KCBA, our builders and architects respectfully. This brings to an end a process that began in 2013! I trust that most of you are pleased with what we have been able to achieve through hard work and generous hearts! Again, I am deeply grateful to the Facilities Committee, namely, Ed Clark, Kirk Clauss, Deacon George, Jim Crumlish, Father Stokley and Father Biedrzycki. Their expertise and guidance have profited us greatly in seeing that we got the most for our money and kept the project moving forward in a timely fashion. Now that everything is completed, the construction loan from First Niagara has now become a mortgage with Key Bank with our first payment due on February 1, 2017. The mortgage is for twenty years but hopefully, with the consistent generosity we have seen thus far, we may be able to fulfill our indebtedness to the bank sooner. THANK YOU to all who contributed to this effort and allowed it to become a reality. I can't tell you enough how practical and useful the parish office center has become for so many. Just this past Monday, three different groups were in the center, in different locations, conducting their meetings without conflicts or interruptions. It works beautifully!

As we find ourselves in the celebration of Ordinary Time, let us recognize that there is nothing ordinary about our relationship with the Lord and the graces that he so generously bestows upon us and our parish community.


