



Second Sunday Ordinary



Dear Friends,

This weekend we begin a stretch of Ordinary Time Sundays that will last for about a month. Some have called this segment of Ordinary Time a "season of discipleship" because the Gospel readings cover the early ministry of Jesus and the calling of the first disciples. This weekend we heard Jesus at the wedding feast of Cana, traditionally the third manifestation of Christ following Christmas and the Epiphany. Maybe this week we can make a concerted effort to see Jesus in all we meet this week — continuing His manifestation in the world and in our lives.

On Monday we honor the memory of Doctor Martin Luther King, Jr, a man who brought to our nation a vision of equality and respect for all peoples. This is a day in which many people devote time for service to those in need. Let us always show respect and honor to our fellow men and women as our appropriate response to the Gospel message of Jesus Christ.

Also, this Friday, January 22, 2016 is the annual March for Life in Washington, DC. Our parish is once again sponsoring a bus to transport marchers for this important witness for life. If you are able to join us, please contact Len and Jan Cline (215.343.4572) for information and reservations. The bus will leave the parish property at approximately 8:30am and return sometime near 9:00pm. Although it is a demanding day, to be with so many people gathered for the same purpose, it is equally energizing for those who participate. If you cannot join us on Friday, please pray for the safety of all those who will be traveling on Friday and, of course, for the future legal protection of all life from conception to natural death.

On Saturday of this week our third graders will receive the Sacrament of Penance for the first time. This is an important step in our young people's experience of the Lord's mercy and forgiveness. Please pray for them and for their parents that this day will lead them all to the grace of reconciliation and peace!

As you can see, walls are gradually being built for our new narthex. Hopefully this week the steel will begin to give shape to the structure. As a heads up, there will be some additional work that needs to take place in church to accommodate the new Receiving Room which will be used as a Cry Room, Viewing Room and Brides Room when completed. This will necessitate a temporary wall in church as well as the relocation of some pews. Also, there will come a time in the near future that the duct work and new soffit will be installed. This will demand some patience and understanding on everyone's part. The reason for the new duct and soffit is the deterioration of the present one, it having been compromised by poor electrical work done in the past, as well as to accommodate the new HVAC units relocated to the front of the church. For all of this to be accomplished, we may need to move daily Masses into the hall and relocate funerals to another church. I will keep you as informed as I can with these necessary adjustments that our future construction schedule may demand.

May Saint Robert Bellarmine bless our efforts for peace, respect and reconciliation!







THE WEDDING FEAST OF CANA — SECOND SUNDAY IN ORDIARY TIME

The Sacrament of Marriage Comes from God

When two baptized Christians enter into the Sacrament of Matrimony, they signify and share in the mystery of unity and fruitfulness that characterizes the bond between Christ and his Church. Accordingly, married couples have a special place and gift among God's people. Marriage can be discerned in the very design of Creation, where God creates humanity with two genders, male and female, each needing the other for completeness and companionship. God's vision for marriage, found in many biblical texts, culminates in Jesus' teaching where he explains that the bond between husband and wife is unbreakable (Matthew 19:8). Marriage, raised to the dignity of a sacrament by Christ himself, is nurtured by the Church as an esteemed vocational calling.



Distinctiveness of Church Teaching

In marriage there is no holding back. The love of husband and wife involves a totality of the body, instinct, power, emotion, as well as the aspiration of spirit and will—all of these facets combine together to achieve a deep personal unity which goes beyond physical union. This kind of union is, in part, the rationale which demands the indissolubility of marriage. Marriage of the baptized is a union that can only be achieved through the grace of Christ who, at Cana, transforms water into wine, and who, among husbands and wives, transforms their words and deeds into fruitful vowed lives.


