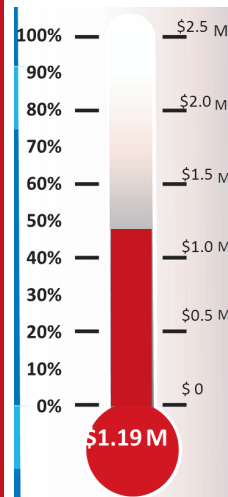

Dear Friends,

Now that Ordinary Time is underway, we will be hearing from Saint Mark's Gospel for most of this liturgical year. So this week, we heard his version of the call of the disciples. The disciples were at their daily task, fishing, when Jesus approached them. 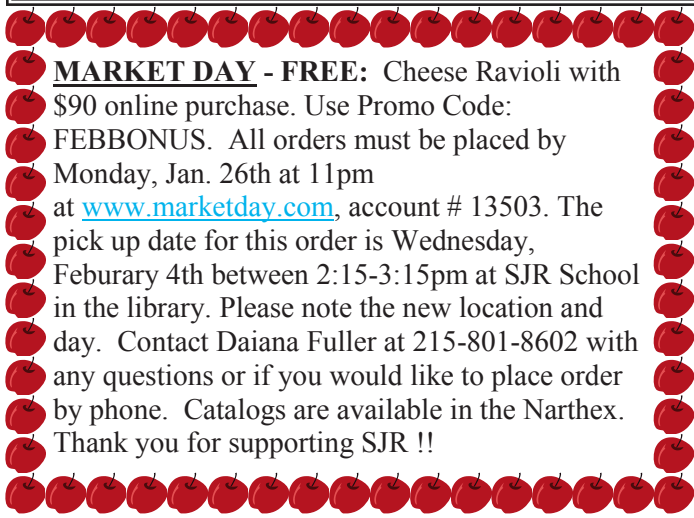
Tomorrow morning, fourteen of our grade 8 students and I will accompany the people traveling from St. Robert's parish to participate in this event. The day is also a day to

THIRD SUNDAY ORDINARY TIME

Jonah 3:1-5,10; 1 Corinthians 7:29-31; Mark 1:14-20



Today's Gospel describes how Jesus called his first disciples and the immediacy with which these men dropped everything to follow him. We can only begin to imagine what Jesus' presence must have been like to invoke such a response in these first disciples. While a few of us might relate to such a radical conversion, many of us would find such a sudden change in ourselves or in another person unsettling. There are few things for which we would willingly drop everything. And yet this is the immediacy with which these first disciples responded to Jesus. These first disciples were willing to drop everything in order to make Jesus and the Kingdom of God the most important things in their lives.

What must you leave behind in order to follow Jesus more faithfully as a disciple?

How do you integrate you "call" into the ebb and flow of everyday living?

Praise God that each Sunday at Mass we can come and reexamine our priorities, and leave nourished and renewed for the journey!
