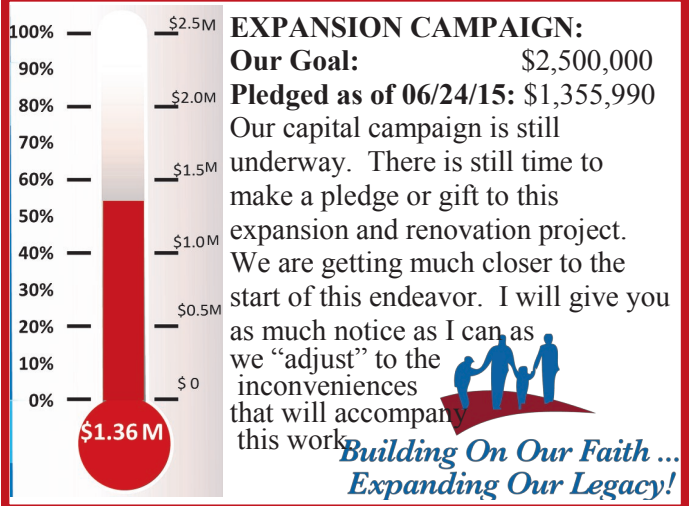

The Fifteenth Sunday



In Ordinary Time

Dear Friends,

The celebration of the Fifteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time is all about those who are called: Amos the prophet, the twelve apostles, and us – all who have been baptized. What do we all have in common? Amos and the Twelve responded to God’s call within the context of their everyday lives. And us? Through the Eucharist we just celebrated and the grace of this sacrament, perhaps this is the week that we realize that we are called to respond to Jesus just by how we live the ordinary, everyday experiences of life and the choices we make every moment of the days we have on this earth.

Next weekend our parish teens will be traveling to Steubenville, Ohio for their annual spiritual weekend. It is during this experience that they will encounter other teens from around the country who will gather for talks, Mass, the sacrament of Penance and time before the Blessed Sacrament. This is a special time of prayer and reflection for our young people. Father Stokely and Deacon Mark will be accompanying Barb Palo as adult leaders for this weekend. Please hold our young people in your prayers as they travel to Ohio to meet the Lord and encounter His presence in the sacraments and one another.

The asbestos abatement phase of our parish project is now complete. We now look forward to the demolition to be completed so that the construction may begin. This is exciting to finally see something happening to realize the expansion goals that we have set. **As I stated before, this project will cause inconveniences for everyone.** What we need to pray for is patience as we readjust our weekly routines when it comes to attending Mass. Just as one example, the access through Monsignor Marley Hall to the church will be curtailed. There will be no lobby in the very near future. The side entrances will be the only doors available to us for some time. More information will be shared, hopefully in a timely manner, once we get the work schedule finalized with the construction company. Communication will be the key – and I hope to share as much as I can with all of you.

In the meantime, we are still in need of financial support for the expansion/renovation project. If you have not done so already, PLEASE consider a pledge or gift to the capital campaign. We have been receiving some very consistent gifts but there are many families who have yet to respond to our request for a donation or pledge. We are currently over \$1.3M in pledges and gifts in addition to the \$1.0M from parish savings. Currently that means that the parish will be borrowing \$1.0M to complete the project. With every family contributing something we could reduce, or at least minimalize, the need to engage a construction loan and mortgage. There is no gift that is too small. Every cent counts and is deeply appreciated.

Families continue to open their homes to our guests for the meeting of the World Meeting of Families in September. We still could use more housing. If you can, please consider this opportunity for hospitality by completing the form in the bulletin and place it in the collection or drop it off in the parish office. THANK YOU!

May Saint Robert Bellarmine continue to bless our parish and all its members!

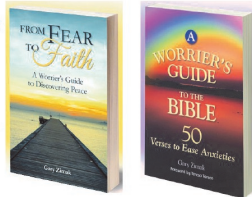

FIFTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Amos 7:12-15; Ephesians 1:3-14; Mark 6:7-13



“Jesus *summoned* the Twelve.” he sent them off to preach repentance. The mission Jesus gave to his disciples is the same mission given to us every Sunday when we are dismissed (sent forth) from Mass. Jesus received that mission from the Father and set out to fulfill it after his baptism by John. At our sacramental baptism, each of us was anointed “priest, prophet, and king.” By our baptism, we are summoned and given the challenge to be bearers of the Good News and to preach repentance.

We may not be traveling to nearby towns or distant shores in missionary work. Perhaps our own mission area is our family, our workplace, our school, or our neighborhood. We have the opportunity to respond to the summons, to our baptismal call, on a daily basis.

10 Simple Tips for Better Mealtimes

The growing body of statistics confirming the benefits of regular mealtime is compelling. Here are ten easy tips to make mealtime more positive:

1. Commit to a set time for meals (daily, weekly, or according to your schedule).
2. Turn off the TV, computers, handheld games, and don't answer the phone. Don't flip through your mail.
3. Use prayer to mark the transition from busyness to mealtime. Be mindful of those who do not have enough to eat today.
4. Slow down enough to taste and enjoy your food.
5. Hold one conversation at a time. Everyone gets a chance to speak. You can disagree, but you can't be unkind about it.
6. Encourage laughter.
7. Practice manners, such as saying please and thank you and asking politely for people to pass the salt, and so on. Everyone stays at the table until they're excused to leave.
8. Give everyone a role in preparing or cleaning up. Even small children can help set the table or put the napkins in place.
9. Regularly invite guest to your table. Welcome them as you would welcome Jesus. Treat your family members the same way.
10. Always start with grace or a prayer of gratitude and thank the cook!
