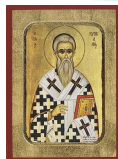

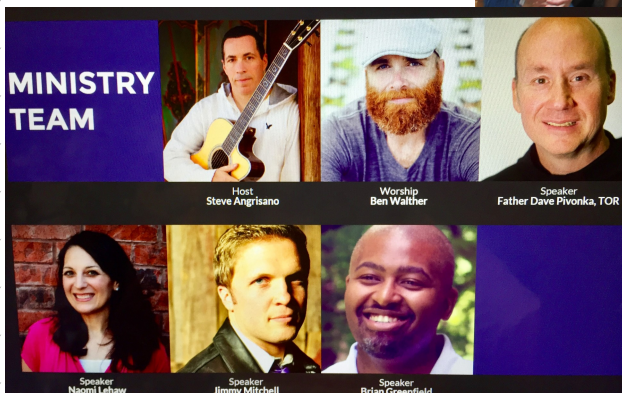

So long as we live, they too shall live, **for they are now a part of us as we remember them.** (Jewish Prayer-book)

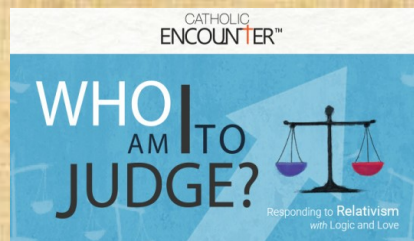
