



## The Twelfth

Continuing with our Ordinary Time Sundays, we will hear from the Gospel of Mark almost exclusively until the end of the liturgical year. The Gospel of Mark is the oldest and the shortest, and his writing is the most succinct of all the Gospels. Scholars hold that Mark chose to write about Jesus' life and teachings in order to deepen the faith of his community in the Cross and Resurrection. In today's Gospel, Jesus is shown to have the same authority over the powers of nature that we see attributed to God in the first reading. Indeed, the disciples are filled with wonder and awe. Having heard these words, what can we say about the authority that Jesus possesses over our world today and, more importantly, over our own lives?

Today (Sunday) is Father's Day. We have been remembering the intentions of our parish fathers throughout the month of June. This Sunday all the Masses have been (or will be) offered for the intentions of the fathers whose names are on the remembrance envelopes placed in the sanctuary. 

prayer, Mass and Adoration led by the talented Matt Maher and several others.



How strong is your faith?
When storms come your way, how does your faith help you weather them?

#### Reflections on Father's Day

(from an article by Tom McGrath, author of Raising Faith-Filled Kids)

- St. Joseph seems to have been a man of few words but plenty of action. Through and reflection, Tom has witnessed four wisdom principles in St. Joseph, the patron saint of fathers, workers and the universal Church.
- 1.1. Every difficult family situation is best meant with compassion. Joseph acted with compassion when he heard Mary's story. He planned to divorce her quietly instead of exposing her to shame. Sometimes we tend to act with righteousness but acting with compassion flows from human connection rather than separateness. Compassion demands that I see my wife, my child, a co-worker, as a person.
- 2.2. Expect God to speak to you. And be willing to listen. Joseph listened to the angel when told not to be afraid to bring Mary into his home. He acted decisively when he must have been bewildered. Many times we are in bewildering situations with our children. In prayer, Tom says that the words he and his wife often receive are: "Love them through it." St. Joseph is truly an inspiration for listening and act upon messages from God.
- 3.3. Practice your religion; it will help you discover who you are and why you are here. As was the practice Mary and Joseph presented the child Jesus in the temple and learned from Simeon and Anna Jesus's great role in human history. When he was lost in the temple, they witnessed his deepening understanding of his identity and destiny. How about when we prepare our children to receive the sacraments? We have the privilege of being the first witnesses of the faith to our children. We have the pleasure of watching them experience God's mercy and love present to them everyday!
- 4.4. We are all here to do some work. "I must be about my Father's work." (Mt 2:49) St. Joseph, patron saint of workers, built things, solved problems and restored broken items. It is not surprising that his son's teachings were full of references to work: "A sower went out to sow"; "A man built a tower"; "A woman came to draw water from a well." Parenting children is work...physically, emotionally, and spiritually. How consoling to have the tools of the carpenter at our disposal—compassion, attunement to God's word, life-bringing religious practices and an awareness that God is at work in the world and at work in me.

Thank you St. Joseph, for inspiring the work of being a father!

You must be a registered member of the Parish and must notify the priest at least six months prior to your marriage date. Pre-Cana classes (2nd Sat. in March. & 2nd Sat. in November) are required. Contact Parish Office for registration forms, due 2 weeks in advance of the Pre-Cana Class

#### **EUCHARISTIC ADORATION**

Adoration - Each Monday (except Summer & National Holidays) after the 9 am Mass, with simple Reposition (No Benediction) at 4 pm. At 3 pm the Divine Mercy Chaplet is recited.

#### SAFE ENVIRONMENT PROGRAM

All parish staff and volunteers who have regular contact with voung people must attend a Protecting God's Children Awareness Session. In addition background checks must be updated every 5 years. Links to background checks can be found on the website. Visit our website, click on Community, then Safe environment. It will direct you to the Child and Youth Protection Site. If you have not completed your background checks and the class YOU **MAY NOT VOLUNTEER.**
