

EXPANSION CAMPAIGN:

Dear Friends,

Right at the beginning of a long stretch of Ordinary Time Sundays, the Church gives us this celebration of the Body and Blood of Christ. This is a good time for us to reflect upon the great gift of the Eucharist we receive each weekend and our response in faith to the power of the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ in our life, love and relationships with those around us. It is also a time to reexamine our preparation in receiving this great sacrament and our thanksgiving for the gift. In essence, this Sunday gives us the pause to reflect, honor and give praise for this intimate presence of Jesus to us.

This weekend we welcome Reverend Mr. Mark Cavara as our transitional deacon! We pray that Deacon Cavara's year with us will be fruitful in his formation and discernment as he nears his ordination to the priesthood.

As announced last weekend, eighty of our brothers and sisters from the Diocese of Lincoln are looking to us to provide hospitality for their pilgrimage east for the World Meeting of Families and the visit of Pope Francis. I am indeed grateful to Father Stokely for accepting the responsibility for coordinating these efforts on behalf of our guests. Please consider, as I know many of you have already done so, inviting these pilgrims into your home for lodging and hospitality. There is a form in this week's bulletin for you to complete and return with your commitment to participate. THANK YOU for assisting with this project of welcome for our friends from the Midwest!

You may notice that there is a new donation receptacle in the vestibule of church. Each parish received, through the generosity of Maguire Hayden Partners, this donation box for the World Meeting of Families Philadelphia 2015. Archbishop Chaput is not requiring each parish to take up a collection for this event but has approved the placement of these boxes for the faithful to have an opportunity to donate if they so choose. If you wish, and this is completely your decision, to donate, please place your gift in the receptacle slot. We will be remitting to the archdiocese on a biweekly basis the contents of the donations received. Many thanks for your consideration.

I have not written to you recently concerning our renovation and expansion project. I am happy to report that I have signed the contract with the CH&E Construction Company for this work. We are now awaiting Warrington Township to issue the building permits for our project. It is my understanding that the reviews are nearing completion and so we should see some work beginning in the very near future. As you are aware, we are still in need of the commitment of many more people to reach our fundraising goal. I am deeply grateful to all of you who are making consistent gifts through the use of the monthly envelopes in your packet. We are making steady progress by this method of giving – thank you!

This week marks the closing events for many of our students in Saint Joseph/Saint Robert School. Our Pre-K will have their closing exercises on Monday; our kindergarten will have their graduation on Tuesday and our eighth grade will have their Graduation Mass on Wednesday evening at 7PM. Our school will close on Friday with a Mass at 9AM with a dismissal at 10:30 AM. These are busy days but happy ones for those who will graduate and those who will be promoted to the next level of education. I take this opportunity to thank our principal Mrs. Jaster, our faculty, staff and volunteers, our school parents and students for making this a wonderful school year. We wish all of you a good summer and see you all at Mass!

During this month of June, we remember in prayer, all the intentions which you have submitted through the Father's Day Remembrances. Each day we pray for those intentions and will celebrate all the Masses on Father's Day for fathers, living and deceased.

May this month, with its brilliant long days, remind us of the light of Christ which bring life and love to the whole world!

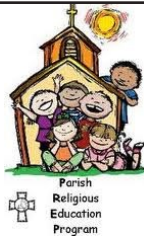

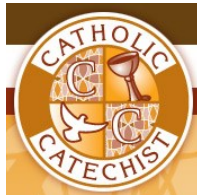

Did you know? Some interesting facts about the Coordinating Council of Health and Welfare as of July 2014 they will be operating here for 56 years. They service families in Warminster, Warrington, Hatboro, Richboro, Willow Grove, Horsham and Huntington Valley. This year they have provided assistance to approximately 800 families and sadly, this number is up from 680 families in 2013.



The services that the CCHW provides depend entirely on volunteers, they have no paid staff members. The volunteers interview clients each Monday, Wednesday and Friday morning , while others pack food orders for each family who needs help. Groups of helpers unpack, sort the food and stock the shelves with food delivered by various local churches and service organizations.

Everyone pitches in to keep the office and cupboard clean. They encourage men and women who are interested in volunteering to call the cupboard at 215 672 9422 for information.
