

The Twelfth Sunday

Dear Friends.

The Gospel for this Twelfth Sunday in Ordinary Time will help set the tone for the coming weeks and months of our liturgies. Having placed our faith in the Messiah, we are told that we must take up our cross every day and follow him. This is only possible through the strength and graces we receive through the power of Christ's own death and resurrection, with the sending of the Holy Spirit which completed this Paschal Mystery. One of the most difficult aspects of the Christian life is to accept the personal crosses which come our way and to carry them with the dignity and strength offered through sacramental communion with the suffering and risen Christ!

This weekend we celebrate Father's Day, a day in which we remember and celebrate our dads. We have been remembering in prayer this month the intentions of the Father's Day Remembrances submitted to us. This weekend we offer all the Masses for these same intentions.

In Ordinary Time On Monday, June 20th, the priests involved in the clerical changes announced in May will take their places in their new assignments. We remember in a special way, and with much love and gratitude, Father Stokely who will be moving to Saint Elizabeth Parish in Chester Springs, PA. The new address for Father Stokely is P.O. Box 695, Uwchlan, PA 19480-0695. We will welcome Father Matthew Biedrzycki to our parish on Monday as well. I am confident that you will welcome him with the same warmth and support that you have shown each of our priests as they began their ministry here at Saint Robert's. Please keep Father Stokely, Father Biedrzycki and all the priests who are making a transition in ministry this week.

Also, this Monday, we begin our summer PREP program. Our parish children will attend their religious instruction classes all day this week, Monday through Friday from 8AM until 3PM. I am grateful to Mrs. Heeney, Mrs. O'Neill and to the catechists and volunteers who make this program possible. We are one of the few parishes in the archdiocese who offer this program. It is only possible because of the generosity of our catechists and the willingness of Mrs. Heeney to organize and execute this summer program. Thank you for your generosity and we look forward to welcoming our parish children to class this Monday.

Members of our teen group will be leaving this Wednesday to participate in the Steubenville Retreat weekend in New York. Let us keep them in our prayers as they leave to join other teens from around the area to pray, learn and enjoy the presence of the Lord. Thank you to all the parishioners who sponsored our young people for this annual retreat weekend.

As you can see we are making some significant progress with our parish expansion projects. The new Parish Office Center and Narthex are currently scheduled for completion at the end of this month. Once construction is completed and we are issued an Occupancy Permit, we will begin using our center and narthex. We will not be able, because of schedules and the time of year, to conduct a formal "Grand Opening" of these areas, but we hope to hold some kind of official blessing and dedication ceremony in early September. I am continually amazed at the generosity that continues to come in each week to support this expansion project. The yellow envelopes continue to be sent each week as well as the conscientious fulfillment of pledges that we received two years ago. As we get ready to place the Cornerstone that will be sealed in the main entrance to church, we are preparing a roster of donors that will be included in the cornerstone. There they will remain in perpetuity. The reward, as with all generosity, is reserved for heaven! THANK YOU. ONE AND ALL!

As we greet the official beginning of summer this week, may the days ahead be filled with the warmth of the Lord's graces and favors for each one of us!



TWELFTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Zechariah 12:10-11; 13:1; Galatians 3:26-29; Luke 9:18-24

"But who do you say that I am?" Peter said in reply, "The Christ of God."

Jesus — In Hebrew the name means, "God saves." And indeed, through Jesus, through his life death and resurrection, God is saving us.

3 Easy Ways to Celebrate Father's Day Every Day

Many parents get caught up in the whirlwind of after school activities, planning for fun-filled vacations, working hard to save for their future, and buying things that bring smiles to their faces. 

SAFE ENVIRONMENT PROGRAM

All parish staff and volunteers who have regular contact with young people must have their background checks and training to volunteer with our youth.
