

Dear Friends,

The Sunday Gospels for the remainder of this liturgical year will take place while Jesus is on the "journey to Jerusalem." In today's Gospel Jesus begins this journey. He does this with some urgency, telling his disciples what they must do to follow him. We all need to set some things aside and also leave some things behind, lest the journey becomes too burdensome and discouragement and disappointment may lead us in the wrong way.

This weekend many of you had the opportunity to meet our new parochial vicar, Father Matthew Biedrzycki. As Father begins his first full week with us here, let us keep him in prayer as he makes this community his new home.

I want to thank all of you who took the time to contact our representatives concerning House Bill 1947. Regardless of the outcome, we have let our voices be heard concerning this very flawed and prejudicial proposed legislation. It is very important that we make our opinions known, especially to those who have a voice in the governance of our local, state and national interests.

This past week our summer PREP was in session. To Mrs. Heeney, Mrs. O'Neil, our catechists, staff and parent and student volunteers, THANK YOU for sharing your time, talent and faith with our young people. We could not conduct this program without your generous cooperation and your willingness to spread the faith by word and deed.

We continue to make progress with our expansion projects. As of this writing, we are looking at completion at the end of June or early July. To date we have received \$1,049,095.99 in campaign pledges and gifts. We are anticipating, with the fulfillment of outstanding pledges, another \$387,631.00. Combined with the assets from our Trust Fund, withdrawn from the archdiocese, we will have \$2,436,727.00 towards the expansion projects. With every contributed penny, it is less that we will need to borrow from the bank. There is no such thing as a small contribution – all are gladly received and very much appreciated! If you have not done so already, would you please consider a gift?

While on the topic economy, I realize that we all need a vacation and should enjoy one if possible. Unfortunately, the expenses to run a parish never leave. If you are away from the parish, please consider "making up" your contributions when you return. Another option is online giving. Whatever you can do to keep the weekly contributions consistent with the ordinary weekly expenses would be greatly appreciated.

May Saint Robert Bellarmine continue to bless our parish with his intercession and prayers!

Ride 2 Recovery Invites the Public to Join Healing Heroes on Bikes – Registration is open for the upcoming Honor Ride Philadelphia, which will take place this year on Sunday, September 18. Cyclists are encouraged join America's healing heroes to raise funds and create awareness for Ride 2 Recovery, www.ride2recovery.com, a unique, ground-breaking rehabilitation program for injured veterans.

Riders of all ages and levels will meet at the Horsham Air Guard Station in Horsham, PA. There will be three separate routes to choose from: 20 miles, 40 miles and 60 miles. The Honor Ride Philadelphia is a self-paced, non-competitive cycling event.

All funds raised through Honor Ride Philadelphia support Ride 2 Recovery's veteran's rehabilitation and recovery program called Project HERO in Philadelphia. There is no cost to veterans to use this program which has proven results enhancing both mental and physical health and wellness of our healing heroes.

"Almost anyone can ride a bike," said Todd Setter, SVP, Events. "These rides are fun and non-competitive. They bring people from all communities together to make a difference. They not only raise funds, but they raise awareness for our veterans recovering from combat related injuries."

The Honor Ride starts at 8:00am (registration begins at 6:45am) with pre-ride festivities beginning at 7:30am. Registration is \$75 until Friday, September 17 at 8pm. Day of the ride, registration is \$85. Riders can get a \$20 discount if they register by June 17.




THE CATHOLIC CHARITIES APPEAL FOR 2016

A NEW VISION". Two weeks ago we outlined how last year's contributions were distributed within Catholic Social Services. This week will outline the total donated vs. spent. The total received last year for the \$10 million goal was



\$10,129,571. The realized total was received from 60,913 gifts averaging \$149.30 per gift and

\$1,035,084 in bequests.



Rounded distribution of the total donations was \$4 million for Catholic Social Services, \$1 million for Catholic Special Education, \$800K for Skilled Care for Retired and Sick priests, \$800K for Mission Parishes, \$400K for Life, Family and Laity, \$500K for Cultural Ministries and \$1.4 million for Foundation Activities

We are currently at 86% of our \$65,364 goal with a total of \$55,996 from 383 donors. Donations can be still be made using the CCA pledge cards now located at the church entrances. Pledge returns can be made directly to the Archdiocese using the envelopes at the same locations or by dropping them in the collection baskets.
