Dear Friends,

For centuries, Catholic tradition has called this Fourth Sunday of Lent Laetare, that is, "Rejoice" Sunday. Today we have the special joy of celebrating the second scrutiny with our catechumens (Brianna, Samantha and Keith) in preparation for their baptism at the Easter Vigil. The Gospel presents Jesus' encounter with the man blind from birth. Because Jesus gives him not only physical sight but spiritual insight to know who Jesus is, the baptismal image of light is prominent throughout today's scriptures and other prayers. This week let us implore the Lord to fulfill his promise to illuminate our hearts with the splendor of His grace. Let us beg God to lead us from the darkness of sin to the radiance of faith.

Monday is the Solemnity of Saint Joseph, the patron of the Universal Church. What a perfect day to attend Mass and to place yourself and your family under the protection of the foster father of Jesus. Allow Saint Joseph to intercede for your needs as he did for his own family as he walked this earth.

This Tuesday our parish will celebrate the sacrament of Confirmation with our sixth grade students. We look forward to welcoming Bishop John McIntyre to our parish for the first time as the confirming bishop. Please keep these young members of our parish in your prayers this week so that they may truly be open to the coming of the Holy Spirit into their hearts, minds and souls and that they will commit themselves to be the public witnesses to our faith that the sacrament demands.

Next weekend we will begin the annual Parish Mission. Services will be Sunday through Wednesday at 7 PM in Church. There will also be a brief Mission talk after the 9AM Mass each day of the Mission. This is a perfect opportunity for spiritual growth and renewal during this sacred season. Please make this a priority for you and your family. Also, invite your friends and neighbors to come and be inspired by the witness of Mr. Bill Wegner, the mission presenter. Come and dare to be holy!

This past Monday, Saint Joseph/Saint Robert School had an assembly at which Ms. Kim Flaville, the CFO of the Connelly Foundation, spoke to our students about the Neumann Scholarship which awards full and partial four year scholarships to the top 5% of students throughout the archdiocese who sit to take the Neumann Scholarship test. This year 889 students qualified to take the test and 763 students actually sat for the testing. The Connelly Foundation has awarded 40 scholarships (full and partial) this year. We are proud to announce that one of our students, THOMAS FUNK, has been awarded a full, four year scholarship! Tommy, who is very active in our school and community, will be attending Archbishop Wood High School next year. You can imagine how happy that makes me as a former faculty member and administrator at Wood! We congratulate Tommy, his family and all his teachers for this wonderful achievement. The installation of the Neumann Scholars will take place at Saint Joseph University on Sunday, May 6, 2012. Great job Tommy!

May these days of the Fourth Week of Lent be a time of grace for you and our parish!

FOURTH SUNDAY IN LENT

2 Chronicles 36:14-16; 19-23; Ephesians 2:4-10; John 3:14-21



In teaching Nicodemus, Jesus uses a familiar story from the Old Testament (Numbers 21:4-9) about Moses. When Moses lifted up a bronze snake in the desert for all to see, those who had been bitten by snakes were healed. Jesus says that he too must be lifted up so that all might have eternal life through him. He will be lifted up on the cross. But he will also be lifted up in his resurrection and in his ascension to the Father. Whoever looks at him in faith will receive eternal life. Followers of Jesus recognize him as the light that came into the world. They live truthfully in the light, unlike those who choose the darkness and do evil deeds.

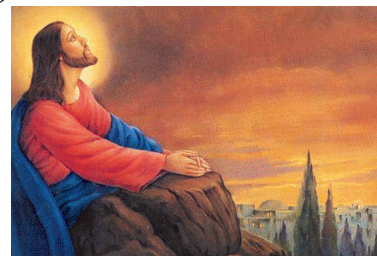

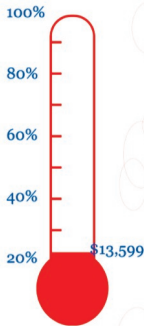
