Dear Friends,

On this Fifth Sunday of Lent, the last of the Old Testament covenant stories looks not backward to the covenants of Israel's long history, but forward. Today, Jeremiah looks toward the new and eternal covenant that is offered in every age to those who, like the Greek's in today's Gospel, would like to see Jesus. In keeping with Lent's call to conversion and purification, the second reading from Hebrews reminds us that we must be prepared to learn obedience through suffering, as Jesus did. Even so, the Gospel resounds with hope, for the seed that dies bears much fruit, a life sacrificed in loving service blossoms into eternal life, and Jesus lifted up from the earth draws everyone to himself. These profound realities should help to prepare us as we move ever more closely to the celebration of Holy Week and its rich liturgies and opportunities for manifold graces.

Congratulations to our young people who received the sacrament of Confirmation last Tuesday at the hands of Bishop McIntyre. May the presence of the Holy Spirit in your young lives inspire you to greatness in loving service to the community and the Church.

This weekend we begin our annual Lenten Mission. We welcome Mr. Bill Wenger and we invite all of you to attend the Mission and to accept the challenge to "Dare to be Holy". Our Mission conference is at 7PM each evening with an opportunity to hear the talk after the 9AM Mass each morning of the Mission (Monday through Wednesday). Please bring your family and friends to this special time of grace and be inspired to grow in holiness!

At a recent meeting of the Finance Committee, the results of the rectory inspection were discussed. Although at first glance the 76 page report appeared daunting, after careful review the committee was able to divide the needed repairs and upgrades into three categories. Because our maintenance supervisor is talented and capable, many of the issues on this list can be handled "in house". The second category requires "professional" workmanship. Among this category is the replacement of the roof, windows, down spouts, electrical panel and wiring in the rectory. The third category can best be described as future maintenance and upgrades which are not critical nor dangerous to those who inhabit the rectory. As you can see, some parish expenditures will be needed to address the maintenance of parish house. In the near future we will be in search of companies to bid on some of these projects. If you know of a reputable company who is also reasonably priced, please contact the parish office and speak with Deacon George. Depending on the cost of these upgrades/maintenance projects will determine when they will be worked into the annual budget. However, we cannot wait too long on the roof. With the last wind storm we discovered shingles peppering the front lawn. As homeowners, I am sure none of this is surprising to you given the age of the rectory and the need for ongoing maintenance on houses. I pledge to you that we will do these projects with a goal towards efficiency and good stewardship.

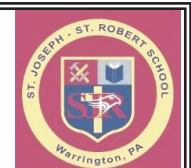

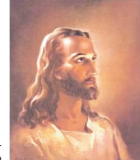

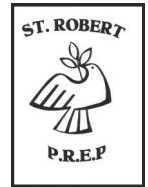

## FOCUS ON FAITH

## FIFTH SUNDAY OF LENT

**Jeremiah 31:31-34; Hebrews 5:7-9; John 12:20-33**



In today's Gospel, Jesus compares his life and ours with a grain of wheat. If the grain falls into the earth and dies, it then rises as a stalk of wheat that gives life by feeding others. Like the grain of wheat, we must be willing to lose our lives in order to gain eternal life.

Jesus knows that the hour of his death when he will be lifted up on the cross is coming soon. But he also knows that when he is lifted up, he will draw everyone, Jews and Greeks and all the world's people, to himself.

What does it mean to you to hear the words "Whoever loves his life loses it..."? To lose your life means to lay down your attachments to anything or anyone that prevents you from following Jesus. *For people your age in today's world, what might some of those things and persons be? Who or what helps you to be a faithful follower of Jesus, not only during Lent but on a daily basis?*

**COVERING OF THE STATUES** – You will notice this week that once again the statues and crucifix are covered. The custom of veiling the images during the last two weeks of Lent hails from the former liturgical calendar in which the Passion was read on the Fifth Sunday of Lent (hence called "Passion Sunday") as well as on Palm Sunday, Tuesday and Wednesday of Holy Week, and Good Friday. For this reason the period following the Fifth Sunday of Lent was called Passiontide. Today, many churches still cover images starting this Sunday until the end of the Lord's Passion on Good Friday.

The purpose was (and still is) to help us concentrate and reflect more deeply on Christ's work of redemption and prepare to enter the holiest week of the year. Take time this week and reread over and over again today's psalm response...

"Create a clean heart, O God." (Psalm 51)

### WHY CATHOLIC?

This past week was the last session of WHY CATHOLIC until the October. The topic was *Guides for Prayer*. We remembered the examples of our favorite saints as models of prayer. We discussed that parents are the first to teach their children how to pray and were reminded that the family is the "domestic church." Often we need guides for prayer and spiritual direction. The sacred liturgy is the most complete and profound prayer of the Church. Also, in our churches we gather for "adoration of the real presence of Christ in the Blessed sacrament.."

For your reflection: *How has your definition of prayer changed during the course of your life?*

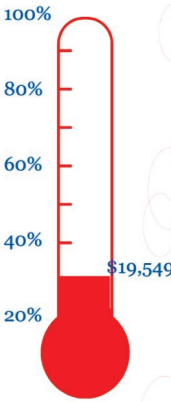
