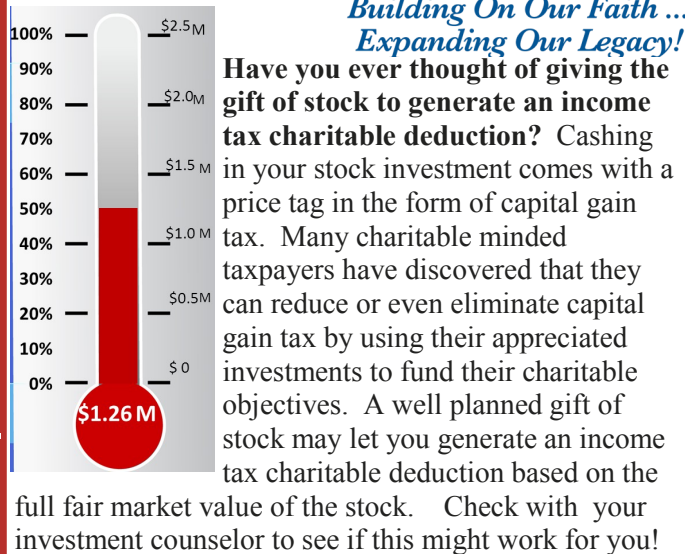

of Lent

The scriptures we heard at Mass on this midpoint Sunday of Lent were indeed challenging. We have the Ten Commandments given to Moses and the Israelites, and we have Jesus confronting the status quo in the temple. Saint Paul can give us the perspective we need: the Ten Commandments are the foundation on which we stand and should obey, but we also proclaim Christ crucified. This week let us think about what it means in our lives when we proclaim Christ crucified.

This week our parish will be blessed by the presence of Bishop John McIntyre who will be here to confirm 92 young members of our community with the power of the Holy Spirit. This reception of the Holy Spirit empowers the whole body of our parish with the strength needed to be witnesses of Christ in the world today. 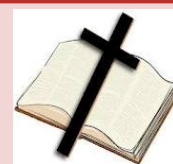

Exodus 20:1-17; 1 Corinthians 1:22-25; John 2:13-25

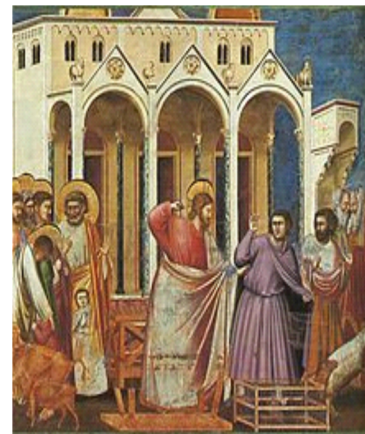
