

Last weekend I had the great privilege of receiving Christine Crim, Lauren Crim and Ross Suter into the Catholic Church through their profession of faith and to celebrate with them the sacraments of Confirmation and First Holy Communion. This brings to completion this Easter Season the baptism and reception of those prepared through our RCIA program. I am deeply grateful to Joan Fitzpatrick and all the members of the staff and parishioners who witness so powerfully in preparing these newest members to our parish community. This week in Saint Martin's Chapel, our seminarian **Jonathan DeMent** will graduate from the College Division of Saint Charles Seminary. Next year Jonathan will be a member of the Spirituality class and then move on into the Theology Division where he will study courses designed specifically for those preparing for the priesthood. We congratulate Jonathan is this accomplishment and assure him of our continued prayers as he journeys closer to his ordination.

Next Saturday, in the Basilica of Saints Peter and Paul in Philadelphia, Archbishop Chaput will ordain four men to the priesthood of Jesus Christ, among them our own Deacon Mark Cavara. The seminary has extended an open invitation for anyone to attend this moving ceremony of Ordination. **There are no tickets required, all are invited**. The Mass begins at 10AM but I would suggest that you get there no later than 9:30AM. The procession of priests begins at approximately 9:40 AM. Please consider this invitation and witness the gift of the priesthood bestowed on these men.

Our school will once again sponsor a 5K Race for Education on Friday, May 20th at 6:30 PM. This is a fun way to support our school and at the same time walk or run for health or fun! As I announced a long time ago, when our new narthex is completed, the current chapel will become a permanent, sacred space. It will no longer serve as a "cry room" for Sundays or a thoroughfare to the sacristy. Last summer we donated the pews in the chapel to a poor church in Philadelphia who was in need of church seating, knowing that the pews would not serve us well in our new permanent space. We have ordered new seating for the chapel, cushioned, yes cushioned, chairs and kneelers. We have also decided to get a more permanent altar, ambo (pulpit) and stand for the tabernacle. These pieces will match the new seating and flooring. If anyone is interested in donating the altar, ambo or tabernacle stand, please contact the parish office for pricing. We will memorialize these pieces with the name of the donor. We can also do that for each chair, if anyone is interested. Please be assured, that we have the necessary monies to procure these additions, but wanted to offer them as an opportunity to remember a loved one in this special way.



Prayer in Communion with Mary (Part 2) "Holy Mary, Mother of God"

The second half of the **Hail Mary** is an intercessory prayer developed in the Church's tradition.





Sometime in the Middle Ages, the second half of the Hail Mary, which begins by invoking her title of Mother of God, was composed. This title comes from the earliest days of the Christian faith. Mary is the Mother of God, because she is the mother of Jesus who is true God and true man (Council of Ephesus AD 431). The Eastern Churches call Mary Theotokos or "God-bearer". Mary's response to God engages her in the plan of human salvation through the motherhood of Jesus.

- "Pray for us sinners." Intercessory prayer concerns the needs and hopes of others. Jesus Christ, as our High Priest, always intercedes for us before the Father, and he calls us to intercede for others as well. The saints and Blessed Virgin Mary continue this prayer of intercession in heaven. Mary, as Mother of the Church, continues to pray with a mother's care for the Body of her Son on earth (us). At Cana, Mary interceded with Jesus on behalf of the couple who ran out of wine. Jesus heard her prayer and turned water into wine. Mary's last words in Scripture are spoken to us: "Do whatever he (Jesus) tells you" (John 2:5). Our holy Mother always brings us to Jesus.
- "Now and at the hour of our death. Amen." In her life, Mary walked a pilgrimage of faith. Even with all the grace she received from God, she encountered the mysterious ways of God and profound suffering, especially at the death of her Son. She knows what a journey of faith entails, and she accompanies us with prayer as we make our journey to God throughout our lives and at death.

We are a 501 c (3) organization partially funded by the resources of our principals and actively soliciting funds from the public. Our mission is to support selected Christian charities raise funds online, and we also pledge to match the online donations at various percentage levels.

One characteristic of TCE that makes us different from other crowd funding websites is that we pay all the fees charged by the fund collecting organizations that we employ; in other words, the charity is the beneficiary of the full amount of each online donation, as the collection fees are paid by TCE.

TCE believes that the pilgrimage to World Youth Day can be a life-changing trip for many youth, and we are embarking on this particular fundraising endeavor as a form of the new evangelization for the whole Archdiocese.
