


God is the model for us of selfless love. There was no need for God to create our planet or the creatures that inhabit it; it was an act of selfless love. There was also no need for God

TCE was founded in 2013 by Terence Darby and Anna Darby-Matteoda in order to create a crowd funding website and to help selected charities in our area, (and some in other states), increase their fundraising outreach. We are a 501 c (3) organization partially funded by the resources of our principals and actively soliciting funds from the public. Our mission is to support selected Christian charities raise funds online, and we also pledge to match the online donations at various percentage levels. One characteristic of TCE that makes us different from other crowd funding websites is that we pay all the fees charged by the fund collecting organizations that we employ; in other words, the charity is the beneficiary of the full amount of each online donation, as the collection fees are paid by TCE.
