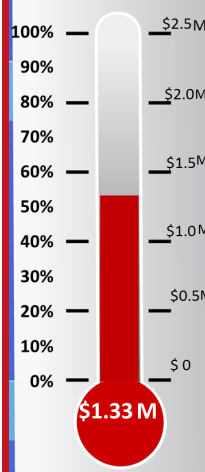

## Sunday of Easter

Dear Friends,

On this Fifth Sunday of Easter our scripture readings all fit together quite well. In today's Gospel from Saint John we heard Jesus proclaim that he is the vine and we are the branches; if we remain in him we will bear much fruit. Our first reading from the Acts of the Apostles described how Saint Paul, newly grafted onto the vine of Jesus, is beginning to bear fruit for the kingdom. And in our second reading from the First Letter of Saint John we were told how to remain on the vine; believe in the name of Jesus Christ and love one another. This week, as we journey in faith, let us recognize the fruitful life of the Spirit in us and to have the courage to be witnesses of the Risen Christ and to love in charity all we meet on the way.

This is a special weekend in the parish as many members of the community have the opportunity of encountering Jesus in their reception of First Holy Communion. This is a memorable day for them and for us. This first reception gives us the opportunity to reminisce about our own first Holy Communion and how this sacrament has been an abiding treasure in our faith journey. We congratulate our children and their families on this wonderful occasion and pray that they will always remain close to Jesus in Holy Communion.

This Wednesday evening at 7PM we will gather for our annual May Procession. This is a time to mark a special devotion to Our Blessed Mother during this month of May. The devotion will include scripture readings, a homily given by Father Christopher Moriconi, the parochial vicar of Saint Eleanor Parish in Collegeville, the recitation of the Rosary, the crowning of the image of Mary and a procession on our beautiful campus (weather permitting). Also, to mark the preparations for the World Meeting of Families here in our archdiocese, we are inviting families to bring a statue, picture or favorite image of the Blessed Mother for a special blessing during our celebration. ## THE CATHOLIC CHARITIES APPEAL FOR 2015



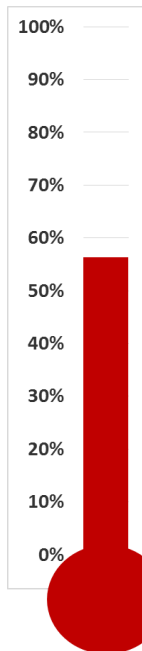

## WORLD MEETING OF FAMILIES


### Monthly Theme 7: LIGHT IN A DARK WORLD


Pope Francis observed that the Church is popular with the world when Catholics work for social justice. But, the Pope continued, with respect to “the cultural crisis” facing the family, “we find it difficult to make people see that when we raise other questions less palatable to public opinion, we are doing so out of fidelity to precisely the same convictions about human dignity and the common good.” This chapter carefully examines subjects such as pornography, contraception, and so-called same-sex marriage. These are topics where Catholic teaching tends to be at odds with current worldly opinion. Reading this chapter in its entirety is an opportunity to consider the reasons for the Church’s teaching. Each one of these issues deserves more space than this summary paragraph can offer. But as we said at the start of this catechesis, all Church teaching about marriage, the family, and sexuality flows from Jesus. Catholic moral theology builds upon basic Christian convictions about God’s creation and covenant, humanity’s fall, and Christ’s incarnation, life, crucifixion, and resurrection. These teachings involve costs and suffering for all who would be Jesus’ disciples, but they also open up new opportunities for beauty and human flourishing. This chapter is your chance to explore how it all fits together, even when it might mean taking unpopular stances in our culture. This chapter explains how every time the Church says “no” to something which secular society accepts, it is for the sake of enabling a deeper “yes” to God and his plan for our lives.
