The Solemnity

Dear Friends,

On this day set aside to remember all the saints of the Lord, we recall that we who live on this earth today are but one part of a church that extends back through the centuries and forward to the end of time. Just as churches have images of saints surrounding them, we are surrounded by the communion of saints, whose lives are shining examples of encouragement for us who try to respond, as they did, to the call of the Beatitudes proclaimed in the Gospel this week. Let our intention this week be to live like God!

As announced last week in my letter, today we as a community begin to discern vocations to the priesthood among us. In the bulletin this week you will listed "Qualities Desired in a Priestly Candidate" along with a Response Card. I ask that you prayerfully review both enclosures and provide a name of someone you know from the parish that would exhibit these qualities and MIGHT be open to exploring this vital vocation for the future of our church. Response cards are requested to be returned as soon as possible but no later than Sunday, November 16th. As you know, vocations to the priesthood and consecrated life have been a priority of prayer here in our parish. We have one seminarian currently in the seminary and we have three other men who have expressed a willingness to consider the priesthood as a vial option for their future. I am sure there are more among us! Asking a person to consider a priestly vocation is often times the first step in the discernment process. It happened to me when I was in the eighth grade and I will never forget it. Perhaps the reason why is that it came to me out of the clear blue. I was not expecting it but the thought was not far once I was approached by the asking. Identify someone and we will, with the help of God, do the rest.

I am aware of two recent graduates from high school who are currently preparing for service in the military. **MARY ELIZABETH LYONS**, the daughter of Pauline and Andy Lyons, had received an appointment this spring to West Point where she is currently matriculating and **DYLAN DEMENT**, son of Nina and Todd DeMent, who began basic training this week for the Army at Fort Leonard Wood in Missouri. I ask that you remember these two young parishioners in your daily prayers as well as all the military personnel who serve our country so bravely. We owe them a debt of gratitude for their willingness to serve and protect us every day.

Monday evening at 7PM we will celebrate a special liturgy for ALL SOULS DAY. At this Mass we will pray, in a special way, for all the souls of those who were buried from our church this past year. Following the Mass, there will be a social in the school library. All parishioners are invited to attend. Please submit the names of your beloved dead so that we can remember them throughout the month of November, the month of the holy souls. On Wednesday of this week we celebrate the memorial of Saint Charles Borromeo, the patron of the Seminary for the Archdiocese of Philadelphia, where most of the priests of this archdiocese were educated and trained. Please say a special prayer for your priests and the current seminarians at Saint Charles; that we may all persevere in our call to ministry to the People of God throughout the archdiocese.

FOCUS ON FAITH ALL SAINTS Revelation 7:2-4, 9-14; 1 John 3:1-3; Matthew 5:1-12a

Every year the Church recalls the example, witness, and prayer of the holy women and men who have been identified by the Church as Saints. These saints are more than just role models; they are family members with whom we continue to share relation, in a bond of prayer, called the Communion of Saints. Every year when we celebrate this day, the Gospel we proclaim recalls for us Jesus' teaching about happiness, the Beatitudes. We quickly note in this reading that none of those Jesus names as "blessed" or "happy" are expected . . . the poor in spirit, the meek, the persecuted. Jesus' blueprint for happiness reflects little of what the world might call happiness.

What does Jesus mean when he uses the word "blessed?" This word is sometimes translated as "happy" or "fortunate" or "favored." In other words, Jesus is saying that divine favor is upon those who are poor, who mourn, who are persecuted. This might have been welcome and surprising news to the crowds who heard Jesus that day.

The Beatitudes can be understood as a framework for Christian living. Because of this, it is natural that we proclaim this Gospel on the Feast of All Saints. Saints are people who lived the spirit of the Beatitudes

THE EIGHT BEATITUDES OF JESUS

"Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.

Blessed are they who mourn, for they shall be comforted.

Blessed are the meek, for they shall inherit the earth.

Blessed are they who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they shall be satisfied.

Blessed are the merciful, for they shall obtain mercy.

Blessed are the pure of heart, for they shall see God.

Blessed are the peacemakers, for they shall be called children of God.

Blessed are they who are persecuted for the sake of righteousness, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven."


