In Ordinary Time

Dear Friends,

As we celebrate the Thirty-third Sunday in Ordinary Time we are drawing near to the end of the liturgical year. The readings for this week, as usual, speak about the end-times. 



Wednesday, November 18 for BIBLE BASICS and Lectio Divina — 7:00 PM in the Chapel

Ever Ancient, Ever New: The Art and Practice of LECTIO DIVINA

Here are the four steps of lectio divina (divine reading that allows us to attune our hearts to the voice of God, which often requires us to become still and silent):

1. Read (lectio) - Choose a Bible passage, maybe the upcoming Sunday Gospel. Slowly read the passage, pausing on a word or phrase that resonates with your mind and heart.
2. Meditate (meditatio) - Read the passage again, thinking about the word or phrase that attracted you. Do you “hear” or “see” Christ in the this verse?
3. Pray (oratio) - Respond in prayer with God, have a conversation with God about what he may be asking of you .
4. Contemplate (contemplatio) - Rest in God’s presence.
