Dear Friends.

First Sunday

On this First Sunday of Advent we recall our Church's long-standing tradition that Advent is a time to mark the three comings of Christ. First, is his coming as one of us, a human born of a woman two thousand years ago. Second is his coming at the end of time. Third is his coming into our hearts. Today the Gospel continued to focus on the end-times, carried over from the last Sundays of Ordinary Time. As one of the elements of Advent, pondering the Second Coming helps us to focus on what is important in our lives and how we are to make ourselves ready for the coming of the Lord. While we know not the day or the hour, Saint Paul in writing to the Romans reminds us to throw off the works of darkness and put on the armor of light. As Jesus says, "Stay awake!" Let us use this sacred time of Advent to welcome the Lord more generously into our minds, hearts and souls.

As usual here at Saint Robert's, there are many opportunities during this sacred season to encounter the Lord. There are extra opportunities to experience the Lord's mercy through the sacrament of Penance. In addition to the regular Saturday afternoon times, we will have our Communal Celebration of the Sacrament on Monday, December 12th at 7PM. There will be no prayer service prior to the time, approximately 13 priests will be assembled in the church and in Monsignor Marley to hear your confession. An Examination of Conscience will be provided for your use prior to this event. On the evening before, Sunday December 11th at 7PM we will have **Lessons and Carols** in church which again offers the opportunity to focus our attention on the great mystery of God's love and the Incarnation of His Son for our salvation. As is the custom in the Archdiocese of Philadelphia, the first Monday of Advent is the **Day of** Sanctification for Priests. On this day all priests of the archdiocese are invited to return to Saint Charles Borromeo Seminary to gather with our archbishop for a time of prayer, reflection, conferences and confessions concluding with benediction of the Blessed Sacrament. It is a wonderful expression of priestly fraternity and prayerful support. I ask that you remember all the priests of the parish and archdiocese on Monday as we spend this time away for refreshment in the graces of the Lord and this holy season.

May this Advent Season, filled with many responsibilities, preparations and distractions, be a time of renewal in the great mystery of the Lord's presence among us! May we all respond to the call of Saint John the Baptist, "Prepare the way of the Lord."

# Spirituality Corner Habits of the Heart Part III What is my awareness of my habits of the heart?

I hesitate to label habits of the heart as good or bad, because our habits form according to what we experience. There's a time to be self-protective and a time to be calm and a time to be more aggressive. The real issue here is our awareness of these interior habits. Do I know what my habits of the heart are? Am I satisfied with them, or do I think they're not serving me well?

- After I have identified these interior habits, I can choose
  to accept them as fine or to work on adjusting them.
   Ex.: I choose to stop focusing on placing blame
  every time something goes wrong.
- In my prayer, journaling, and conversations with trusted spiritual allies, I can name my habits of the heart and voice my intentions. Ex.: God, help me eradicate this vindictive tendency I have. Friend, when you hear me place blame, please call me out.
- By using a prayer practice such as the <u>daily Examen</u>, I can do regular reviews of my interior habits and thus keep assessing and adjusting. Ex.: Okay, I spun into that vindictive space during the status meeting today, but I caught myself and changed course when I started to do the same thing on social media a couple of hours later.

Blessings and graces to you, as you work with the Holy Spirit on this crucial aspect of spiritual growth!



Dear friends,

Earlier this year I alerted you to proposed state legislation that would endanger many of the parishes, schools and charities of Pennsylvania's 3.2 million Catholics. The bill, known as House Bill 1947, contained several provisions to protect children from sexual abuse. Unfortunately, it also contained damaging language that would have allowed retroactive civil lawsuits to be filed against religious and private institutions, while protecting public entities from the same kind of lawsuits for exactly the same kinds of sexual abuse.

In June, the state Senate voted 49-0 in favor of an amended version of House Bill 1947. The revised Senate legislation stripped out the unfair provision on retroactivity, largely because of its incompatibility with our state constitution. The revised Senate bill did, however, keep other provisions in the bill that would have served the needs of abuse survivors.

To move forward, the changes made in the Senate required the bill to be reconsidered in the House. It now seems that the bill will not be considered during the remaining days of the current legislative session. This means that none of its more acceptable measures will be passed into law.

Retroactive removal of the civil statute of limitation is unconstitutional under our Commonwealth's constitution. More importantly, as our pastors, along with many of our lay leaders, families and I stressed this spring, it is unjust. By unreasonably insisting on keeping retroactive provisions in the bill, a small number of individuals failed whole segments of the population who stood to benefit from the bill's other measures.

The Archdiocese is fully committed to protecting our young people from sexual abuse and assisting victims of past abuse with their healing. This will not change. At the same time, we will continue to update you about legislation that threatens the health of our parishes and Catholic ministries. Many of you made your concerns about HB 1947 very clear to our lawmakers this year, and it made a difference. I'm very grateful. When contact with our legislators is done respectfully, in a spirit of good will, the public life of our Commonwealth is well served.

In January a new legislative session will begin. Bills like HB 1947 are likely to resurface. I promise to keep you informed as we deal with these issues.

Monthly to homebound by the priests. Weekly - Extraordinary Ministers if requested. In an Emergency a Priest Should Be Called Immediately call parish office and dial 400.

Please notify the parish office if you are moving from the parish or if you have changed your address.
