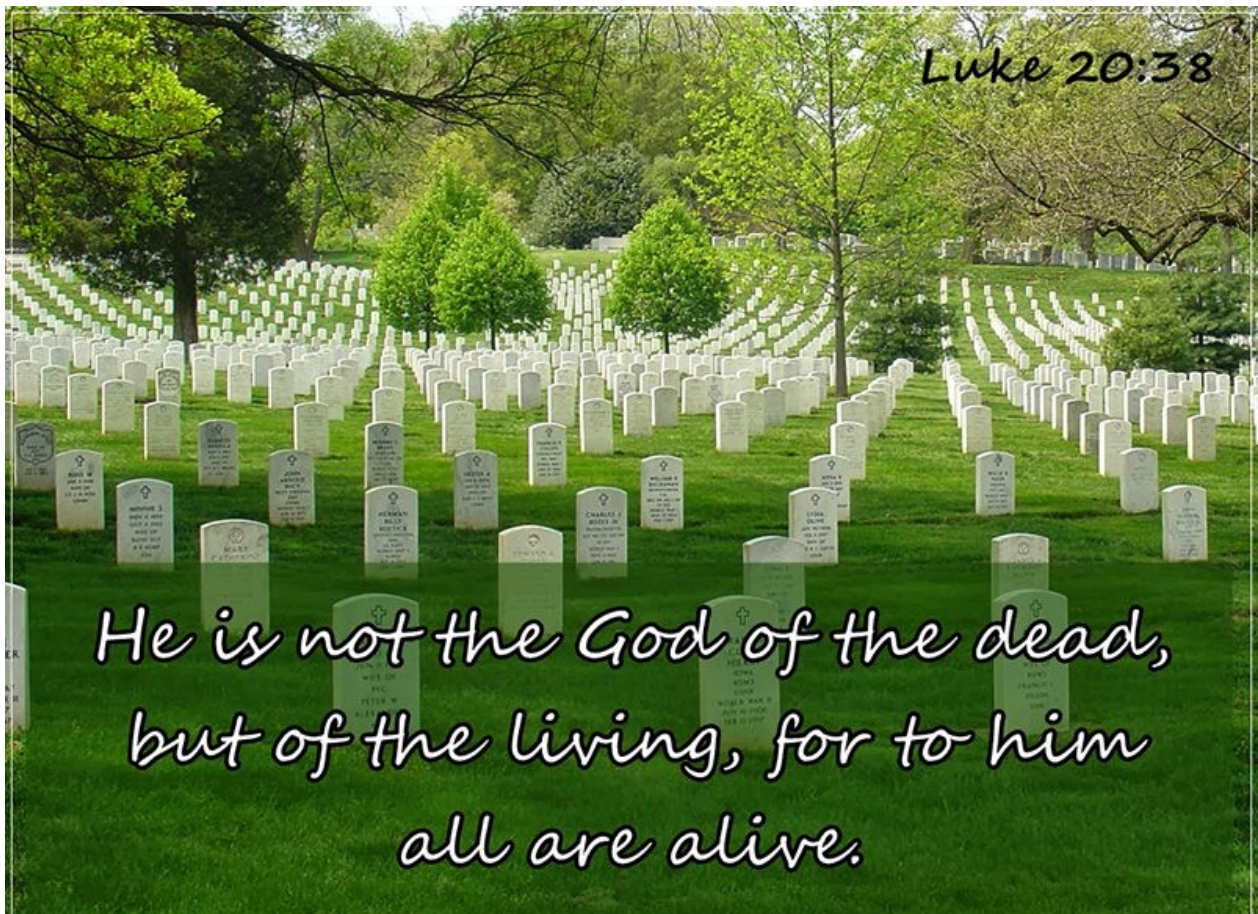

In Ordinary Time

Dear Friends,

At the beginning of this month in which we honor and remember our beloved dead, we encounter scriptures that inspire our faith in the resurrection of the dead. In the face of the unspeakable horror related in the first reading from Second Maccabees, in which seven brothers are slain in front of their mother, who is also about to be killed, their faith in the life to come is remarkable. In the Gospel of Luke we heard Jesus affirm life after death with unassailable logic. This month, dedicated to prayers for the Holy Souls, let us pray for them and for a deeper faith in the promise of eternal life.

During the month of November our seminary, Saint Charles Borromeo in Wynnewood, conducts its annual appeal. This year's theme is: "For Today, For Tomorrow. For all of us." Please refer to the Voters Guide produced by the Pennsylvania Catholic Conference and vote as your faith dictates. Let us continue to pray for one another as we prepare to engage the election process. This week I will be away from the parish. FOCUS ON FAITH

Luke 20: 27-38

This week in the Gospel, some Sadducees question Jesus about the resurrection.

This religious group accepted only the Torah (first five books of the Old Testament) and no subsequent writings such as the prophetic literature.

They believed neither in angels nor in the resurrection

of the dead. Jesus turns the tables on them, using the Torah itself to rebut them and to affirm that in the afterlife worldly constraints give way to eternal realities.

CHURCH TEACHING: HEAVEN, HELL and PURGATORY

- Death is the means by which we pass from this life to the next. Upon a person's death, he or she enters either Heaven or hell, or a time of final purification known as Purgatory. Our actions and decisions in this life have consequences after death.
- At the end of the world, only Heaven or hell will exist.
- Heaven, life with God for all eternity, is often described as the beatific vision, paradise, the new Jerusalem, and eternal happiness. However, God created us free; no one is forced to choose Heaven. Those in Heaven are part of the Communion of Saints.
- Hell or eternal damnation is the inheritance of those who turn away from God intentionally. Those in hell destroyed their relationship with God by freely choosing and persisting in the path of mortal sin. There is no escape from hell.
- Purgatory is a temporary state; it exists to complete the process of sanctification prior to entering into Heaven. Purgatory is not a time of punishment, but of purification. We pray for the souls in Purgatory, and those in Purgatory pray for us on their way to Heaven. We remember them in a special way on November 2, the Solemnity of All Souls.

Domestic Church Media (DCM) currently operates three full time Catholic radio stations in Pennsylvania and New Jersey.
