The Thirty-Second Sunday

Dear Friends,

Over several Sundays of the past month, we have heard scriptures that encourage us to serve others and give completely of ourselves to follow Christ. This Sunday, the Thirty-second Sunday in Ordinary Time, Jesus encounters a concrete example of such selfless giving in the widow at the temple. As a matter of fact, our first reading from the Book of Kings also spoke of a generous and faith-filled widow who gave of the last bit of flour to feed Elijah the prophet. Widows in the ancient Near East at that time in history found themselves in a very unstable condition because not only of the loss of their husband but also the income and social status which came from the marriage. This is why Jesus was especially attentive to the plight of widows and children as was the early Church. The scriptures this week challenge all of us to see how truly generous we are to those in need and to see how faith motivates us to true and lasting generosity.

FOCUS ON FAITH

THIRTY-SECOND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

1 Kings 17:10-16; Hebrews 9:24-28; Mark 12:38-44



The Gospel holds up the poor widow as a model for the total self-giving of a true disciple. It may not be a matter of giving large sums of money, but giving a bit of time each week for the good of another, participating in at least some parish activities beyond Sunday Mass, signing up when volunteers are needed...all makes a difference in the overall parish life.

What does true discipleship mean to me?

LECTIO DIVINA (“divine reading”) This is a form of reading and meditating on the Scriptures that it becomes prayer. Here are the four steps of *lectio divino*:

1. Read (*lectio*)
2. Meditate (*meditation*)
3. Pray (*oratio*)
4. Contemplate (*contemplation*)
