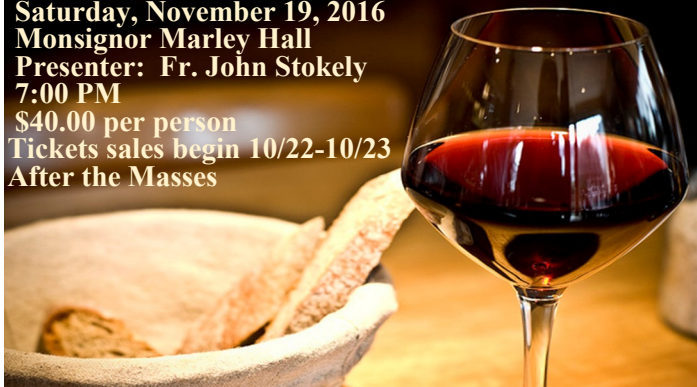

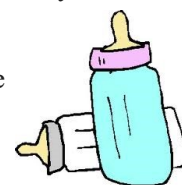

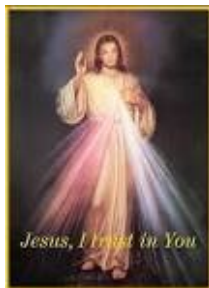

And please Lord,

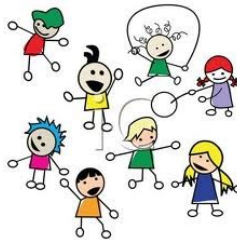

FOCUS ON PRAYER

Forms of Prayer

Adoration This form flows from an attitude that acknowledges we are creatures in the presence of our Creator. It is an act by which we glorify the God who made us. We adore God from whom all blessings flow. (Mass is the most perfect form of adoration)

Petition This is a prayer that takes many forms: to ask, to implore, to plead, to cry out. In each case, it acknowledges how much we depend on God for our needs, including forgiveness and persistence in seeking him. We need to practice the prayer of petition, remembering Christ’s call to ask in order to receive, to seek in order to find, and to knock in order that the door may be opened. Humility and repentance characterize a prayer that returns us to communion with Christ.

Intercession This is the prayer that we make on behalf of the needs of others. Jesus Christ himself, our great High Priest, incessantly intercedes for us. God calls us also to intercede for each other and even our enemies. Intercessions for others’ needs are part of the Mass and the Liturgy of the Hours.

Thanksgiving This form of prayer flows from the Church’s greatest prayer, the celebration of the Eucharist. Every moment or event can become a thanksgiving offering. We are called to thank God for all the gifts we have received, including our joys and sorrows, all of which, through love, work towards our benefit.

Praise “Praise is the form of prayer which recognizes most immediately that God is God...It shares in the blessed happiness of the pure of heart who love God in faith before seeing him in glory” (CCC #2639).
