

### The Twenty-Ninth Sunday

Dear Friends,

As we heard in the scriptures for this Twenty-ninth Sunday in Ordinary Time, the disciples in Mark's Gospel still don't seem to get it! Now the apostles James and John are asking for favors from Jesus, instead of asking what more they can do. Jesus' response makes it clear that a true disciple follows Jesus in every way, including giving oneself over to serving others. Today, we are reminded through them, that whoever would be great must be the servant of all. This week's challenge, as it is every day, is to be thankful to God for the great gift of Jesus Christ, and to pray each day for the grace to become more like him.

As you may be aware, the Synod on the Family has been taking place in Rome during this month, beginning on October 4th. This will be the last full week of the deliberations by over 270 bishops and a number of lay faithful. The purpose of this Synod is to examine family life in the world today and to explore possibilities of how the Church can support the family and its life, especially in light of the multi-faceted challenges that the cultures bring to this most fundamental unit of society. Our own archbishop is participating in these deliberations and he has asked for continued prayers for the outcome of Synod. As an intention for your rosary this week, perhaps one for the inspiration of the Holy Spirit on the Synod Fathers would be appropriate and appreciated.

It is so hard to believe that we are half way through this beautiful month of October. Before you know it Christmas carols will be playing on the radio! However, between now and then, we have a month dedicated to the Holy Souls. You should have in your possession an envelope to list all the names of your beloved dead. Please fill out the names and submit them so that we can remember them each day in prayer during the upcoming month. We are reminded that it is a holy and wholesome thought to pray for the dead.

Because of construction here on the property, it was determined not to conduct the annual fall Blood Drive in Monsignor Marley Hall. This is unfortunate but with dust in the air, safety rules. However, I have been contacted by the American Red Cross to ask that those who usually donate here if you would please consider participating in a Blood Drive on FRIDAY, OCTOBER 23rd at C&C FORD CHAPMAN (across from the former Willow Grove Naval Station) on Easton Road from 2 to 7 PM. There is a very real concern for donations especially as the holidays and more challenging weather sets in. Thank you for your kind consideration to this request.
