

As hard to believe as it may be that in all the vast universe God hears our prayers, the scriptures told us today that "the prayer of the lowly pierces the clouds." This week, let us continue our Sunday prayer by walking humbly with our God and to call upon Him daily for mercy!


I want to take this opportunity to speak about a couple of issues now that we are in our new narthex. As I wrote to you previously, I think we need to be more aware of the level of noise in the church prior to and after the celebration of Mass. It is my hope that we can develop a sense of sacred space and prayerful silence which should surround this area of our campus. I am grateful to the ushers who have been managing the entrance doors to the church to try to facilitate this prayerfulness. We are making progress but we have some ways yet to go.

In line with this prayerful atmosphere, I just want to remind those who need to leave church early because of some extraordinary reason by way of the side doors near the prayer garden, please exit quietly. The doors make noise when closing and this has been a great source of distraction to all of us left behind. This is particularly noticeable at the 7AM Mass when there is no singing. If you need to leave early, please leave quietly as not to disturb those receiving Holy Communion or offering their prayer of thanksgiving. Thank you for your cooperation in this matter.

As we approach the end of October, please remember the rosary as the means of prayer and meditation for this month dedicated to the Holy Rosary. The intention of peace in the world, our communities and our families should always be a component of our daily prayer!

Today's Gospel warns against a selfaggrandizing stance that denigrates others (the Pharisee). The tax collector, mindful of his sinfulness, speaks directly to God, absorbed in his pleading. He approaches God with true humility. The



mystery of faith is nurtured in a vibrant personal relationship with the living God and that relationship is called PRAYER! In true prayer we strip away all pretense, all the guises and masks we wear in life, to show our innermost self to God.

What is Gospel teaching us prayer and humility?

The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults — **Preparing Adults to Receive the Sacraments**

RCIA is a process of learning, faith sharing and joyful liturgical Rites to celebrate what God has already done in your life. It is an invitation to those who:

-are not baptized

-are baptized in another Christian tradition

-are baptized Catholic but have not received the Sacraments of Reconciliation, Eucharist or Confirmation Jesus said to them, "Come and see."




contribution will put us at goal for his year. Thank you to all of you who give support to this worthy cause. Obviously, our ongoing support is always needed.
