In Ordinary Time

The Thirtieth Sunday

Dear Friends.

Perhaps in your spiritual journey you too have felt like Bartimaeus, the blind man in the Gospel for this Sunday, the Thirtieth in Ordinary Time. We all have moments in our lives when we want to cry out to the Lord: "Jesus, Son of David, have pity on me." This is a natural inclination on the part of all of us, for we are all sinners. As we go forth this week to live the life of a Christian, let our dependency on Jesus increase. Let us turn to Jesus in our time of need!

Our parish will be participating in an archdiocesan initiative entitled "CALLED BY NAME" At the heart of this program is the belief that all of us share in a common calling through Baptism, to which we are invited to respond in a variety of ways – marriage, single life, consecrated life and ordained ministry. The CALLED BY NAME process focuses on priesthood, in calling forth men to consider this vocation. You will be asked to consider who in our parish might serve well as a priest. You will be asked to submit the names of potential candidates that you think possess the qualities of a possible priest. In assisting you in your reflection, some qualities of a potential candidate for the priesthood are: a person of prayer who loves the Lord, a person who is actively involved in the life of the Church, a person who is successful in life, including school, work, and relationships, a "people person", a person with personal integrity, honesty and generosity.

In the bulletin for the next several weeks, there will be a form that you can fill out and return to the parish office indicating a person whom you think would make a good and holy priest. We ask that the Response Card be submitted to us no later than November 15, 2015. From there I will make contact with the individual and let him know of how his name has surfaced as a possible future priest. He will then be invited to a discernment gathering with others from throughout the archdiocese whose names also came to light. This is a very ambitious undertaking, which holds great promise for the Archdiocese of Philadelphia. God continues to call people to serve Him in our world today. The faithful have a responsibility to help identify and invite those called. Please pray for the success of this initiative and consider whom in our midst God might be calling to serve. There will be more information during the next several weeks about this initiative.

Next weekend we begin the month of November, the month in which we pray in a special way for ALL SOULS. Please submit the names of your beloved dead so that we may remember them in a special way in prayer during this month. Also, on Monday, November 2nd we will celebrate our annual Memorial Mass for those who have been buried from our church during the past year. All parishioners are invited to this Mass which will be celebrated at 7PM in church. May they rest in peace!

Progress continues on our parish projects. The office center is now being dry walled and spackled. This is very exciting and we can now see the various rooms for offices and meetings. This phase of the project is scheduled for completion the second week of December. We are almost ready to demolish the former entrance to our church. This should happen the first week of November. The narthex phase of the project is scheduled for completion before Easter. Thank you to all who continue to contribute to this expansion of our campus. We are still accepting pledges and gifts. Please consider assisting with this worthy project. As we said before, EVERYONE will benefit from the project, therefore, everyone should participate in its funding as means allow.



FOCUS ON FAITH

THIRTIETH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME



The Scattered Will Be Gathered (Jeremiah 3:7-9) God's people, who had lost their way and had been scattered in exile, hear God's promise through the prophet Jeremiah: "I have become a father to Israel." When a group of people or a community starts falling apart or fails, it requires leadership to bring it together. What was once a disorganized and disoriented group becomes focused with good leadership. Consolation will be provided, and stumbles will be minimized.

Called by God (Hebrews 5:1-6) The priests of the Old Covenant, who were representatives of God for the people, received this honor not of their own accord but from the divine hand. So too, God chose Christ, saying, "You are my son, today I have begotten you" (Hebrews 5:5). Named and begotten as the only Son of God the

Father, Christ is the eternal priest of the New Covenant.

Following the Lord Along the Way (Mark 10:46-52) Blind Bartimaeus sees in ways that the disciples cannot. He calls out to the Lord, recognizing the power of God in Jesus. Jesus, in turn, calls him. By **faith** the blind Bartimaeus is restored to physical sight. By faith he is enabled to follow Jesus on the way to Jerusalem and the cross. The true gift is that Bartimaeus has been called and chosen to pursue this way.

Do you ever ask of Jesus things that seem impossible? How do you keep your relationship with Jesus healthy and strong?

Saint Robert Bellarmine Parish offers year round opportunities for people seeking more information about the Catholic Faith, the Sacraments and living the Christian Life.





Monthly to shut-ins by the priests. Weekly - Extraordinary Ministers if requested. In an Emergency a Priest Should Be Called Immediately.

EUCHARISTIC ADORATION

Adoration - Each Monday (except Summer & National Holidays) after the 9 am Mass, with simple Reposition (No Benediction) at 4 pm. At 3 pm the Divine Mercy Chaplet is recited.
