In Ordinary Time

Dear Friends,

Gathered as a community of faithful believers to celebrate the Twenty-seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time, and Respect Life Sunday, we know that we are a part of a network of human relationships. Today we are called anew to honor these relationships with our spouse, our children, our friends, and especially the most vulnerable among us, the unborn, knowing that God is always a part of them. This week, let us live in profound prayer and gratitude for each other and for all whom we will meet and serve this week.

This past year we have heard a lot about the worth of the human person. Lives matter, we have read and heard chanted throughout the land. Frustrations have built and were unleashed when people sense that lives were not valued, protected, or given the same dignity and respect. This year's Respect Life theme is **"EVERY LIFE IS WORTH LIVING."** This has been the mantra of the Church since its beginning. This Respect Life month allows us to give expression to this theme by what we say and do to acknowledge in the inherent worth and dignity of every life from conception to natural death. There are opportunities throughout the month to stand up for life and to witness to its value. There are races and witness lines, there is an opportunity to stand vigil at the Planned Parenthood clinic on Louis Drive in Warminster. Who among us was not affected by the recent videos which showed the callousness when speaking about the sale of a human beings parts for profit? This stomach turning insight into the methodology and evil of Planned Parenthood should incite every person of good will to do something to witness to life. It is worth noting that the Church has an outreach ministry to those who procured an abortion and now live with regret. Project Rachel is a program which can assist in the healing process. For we know, and Our Holy Father has reiterated, that everyone can obtain mercy and forgiveness for any sin. The Church, our Loving Mother, extends to those in need of healing, mercy and the chance for a new beginning filled with hope and love. 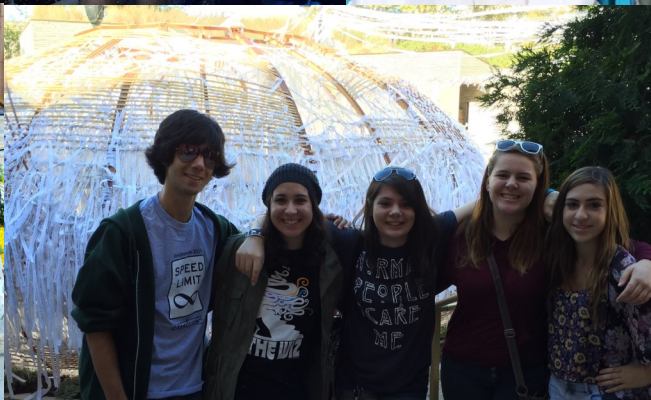
