DIVINE MERCY CHAPLET



JUBILEE YEAR OF MERCY - Forgiving Others Reflection

Without doubt we rejoice in our belief that God is "rich in mercy" (Eph 2:4). We like to meditate on the wisdom of the saints such as St. Francis of Assisi's "Let all who approach you meet the eyes of mercy," and on popular quotes such as "To forgive is to set a prisoner free and discover that the prisoner was you" by L. Smedes. Then comes the moment when we must exercise our spiritual muscles and actually forgive. Yikes! First we have to face that jumble of emotions, the blend of sad and mad that places us squarely in a state of unforgiveness! Then we need to plunge into the process of forgiving in specific ways. In light of this Year of Mercy it is fascinating to note when Je-

sus says, "Love your enemies," he follows it immediately by saying, "Do good to them," so that we won't miss the point. "Doing good" means seeing beyond your pain and their wrongdoing to their humanity. It means seeing them as children of God and understanding that there is something twisted inside (sin) that is linked with what they do. "Doing good" means that you promote and desire their healing despite the way they have treated you. You make the first move. You send the e-mail, pick up the phone, make the contact. You bridge the gap as you "pray it forward" and ask God to bless them. Here's a little forgiveness exercise: May the LORD bless you and keep you, (name the enemy). May the LORD let His face shine on you, ______. May the LORD look upon you kindly, _____, and give you peace (Num 6:22-26) -Sr. J. Sheila Galligan, IHM, Prof. of Theology, Immaculata University

How to Live It Spend some time in prayer, if possible in front of the Blessed Sacrament, and ask the Lord to bring to mind the people whom you need to forgive. Write down the names and use the prayer above to forgive each person. Repeat this prayer exercise regularly until you no longer need to. (Remember that forgiveness is an act of the will and we can forgive even if we still feel angry.) Take note of how the work of forgiveness lightens your heart over time. To continue reflecting on this theme, consider one of these resources!
