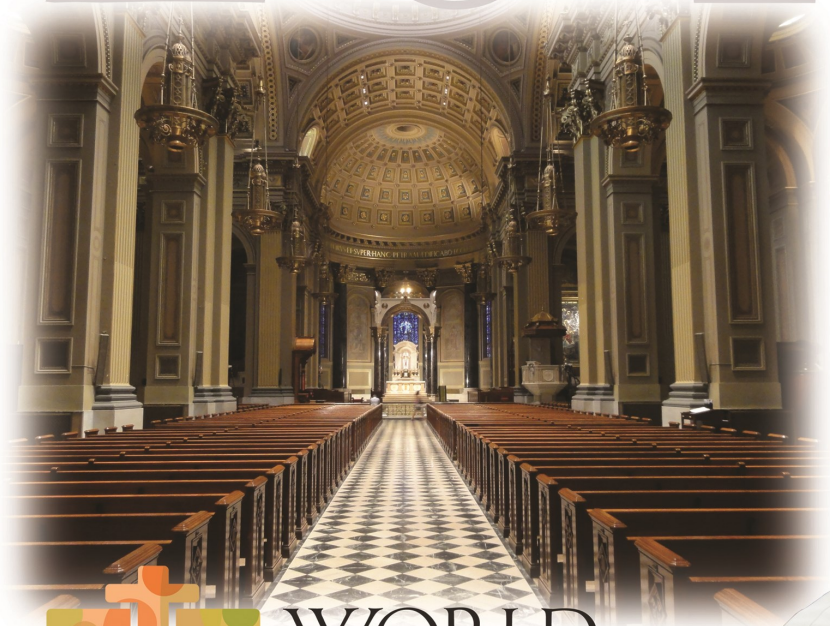

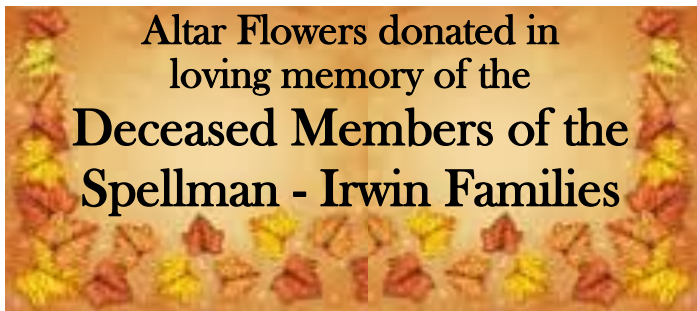

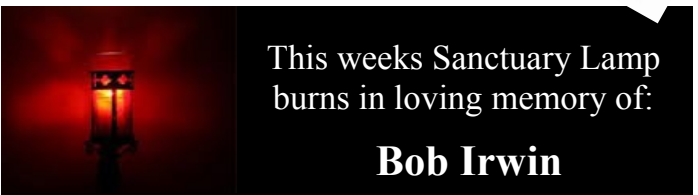

In Ordinary Time

Dear Friends,

It seems that everywhere we turn today, our world is divided into factions. Everyone seems determined to cling to their own perspective, and few seem to care who gets hurt along the way. Even with our Holy Father's visit to our country and our own archdiocese this weekend, there have been various opinions offered ranging from the tremendous cost of this 36 hour visit to the inconveniences that will be a part of ordinary living in Center City. It is hard to change a person's opinion. On this Twenty-sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time, Jesus simplifies things: "Whoever is not against us is for us." Perhaps this week our prayer can be for greater civility in our discourse with others, and for an end to the factions that divide us and keep us from doing God's work in the world.

I want to express the gratitude of Father Stokely, Deacon George and myself for your understanding in allowing us to attend the events of this weekend with our Holy Father, Pope Francis. The change in our regular schedule and routine may have effected some more than others, but your spirit of support and cooperation are always appreciated.

Next weekend is RESPECT LIFE SUNDAY. This year's theme is "EVERY LIFE IS WORTH LIVING" Please consult the Respect Life section of the bulletin to see what you can do to make a this theme a reality in your life and in the world. Our parish will once again participate in the 40 Days for Life. Please help us cover these hours of witness on behalf of the unborn.

As you may notice, the Sunday Offering is down a bit from last year's comparison. This figure may be a bit deceiving at first glance. It is true that the collection in the regular Sunday envelopes is off the previous year's trend. However, we have been receiving generous gifts weekly through the Capital Campaign envelopes that is not recorded in the report printed in this bulletin. Selfishly, I wish the Sunday envelopes would keep the trend from last year, but your generosity continues to support the parish efforts. I don't know about you, but I enjoy seeing the weekly progress for our new narthex and office center. As far as I am aware, we are on target for completion of the Parish Office Center in early December and the Narthex in early March. THANK YOU for your Sunday Offerings, Fall Collection Contributions and for the Capital Campaign donations! YOU ARE THE BEST!!

With all of that said, I am giving you a "heads up" for a mailing that you will receive in the mail shortly. The Parish Fundraising Committee is undertaking a THANKSGIVING RAFFLE from October 25 through November 22. We have not conducted a parish raffle since 2006 when we renovated the hall kitchen. You will receive, in the mail, 3 membership tickets. The membership is \$25.00 for one and three for \$50.00. THIS, OF COURSE, IS COMPLETELY VOLUNTEER! Each weekend beginning October 25 there will be a drawing for a \$200 winner, a \$150 dollar winner and a \$100 winner. The Grand Drawing on November 22 (just in time for Thanksgiving) will be a \$2,000 winner, a \$1,500 winner and a \$1,000 winner. The proceeds of this Thanksgiving Raffle will be used to help defray some of the costs associated with the budget in light of the parish expansion and renovation. If you want additional membership, they will be available in the parish office after the initial kick-off. I trust that you will try to make this a success and at the same time be an additional asset to the parish budget.

I wish to take this opportunity to thank all those who participated in our annual Forty Hours Devotions last week. This is indeed a special time of grace and prayer for our community and I am deeply appreciative of the work of the parish Liturgy Committee, the choir, servers, cantors, lectors, Eucharistic ministers, ushers, and adorers who came and planned this special devotion. I am sure our parish will be blessed by our love for Jesus, in the Blessed Sacrament, and the graces of His presence in our midst.

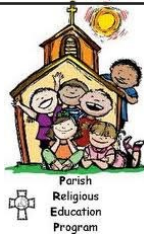

JUST A THOUGHT: What an exciting time for the Archdiocese of Philadelphia! The visit of Pope Francis is certainly a time we will all remember well for many years to come. Once of the many reasons he is so beloved is the simplicity of his life. While still a bishop, Pope Francis shared a simple method of praying that I think is worthy of sharing once again. It is called the "Five Finger Prayer":



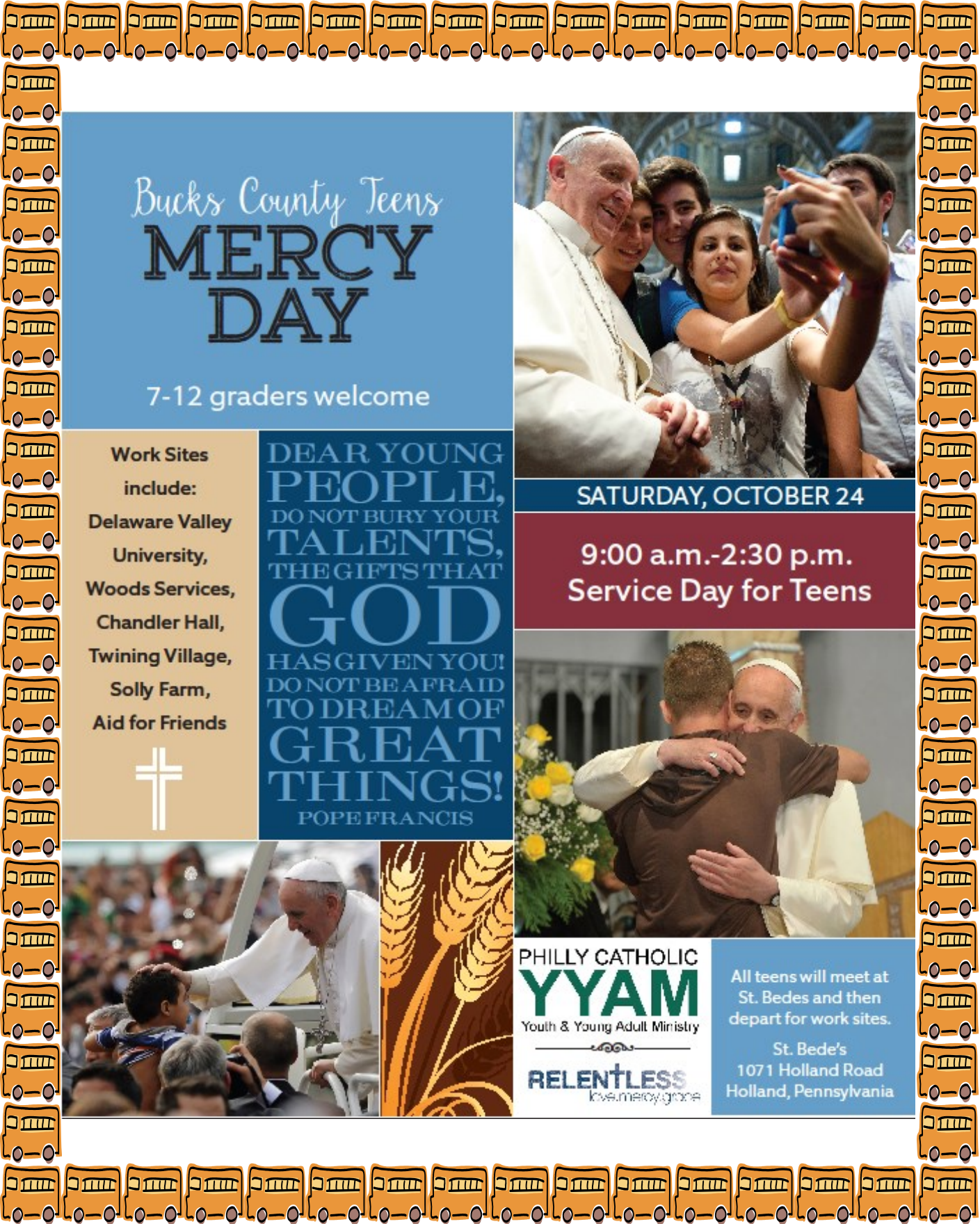
Using the fingers on your hand, start with the thumb and pray these intentions in this order:

- 1.) The thumb is closest finger to you. So start praying for those who are closest to you. They are the persons easiest to remember. To pray for our dear ones is a "Sweet Obligation."
- 2.) The next finger is the index. Pray for those who teach you, instruct you and heal you. They need the support and wisdom to show direction to others. Always keep them in your prayers.
- 3.) The following finger is the tallest. It reminds us of our leaders, the governors and those who have authority. They need God's guidance.
- 4.) The fourth finger is the ring finger. Even though it may surprise you, it is our weakest finger. It should remind us to pray for the weakest, the sick or those plagued by problems. They need your prayers.
- 5.) And finally we have our smallest finger, the smallest of all. Your pinkie should remind you to pray for yourself. When you are done praying for the other four groups, you will be able to see your own needs but in the proper perspective, and also you will be able to pray for your own needs in a better way.

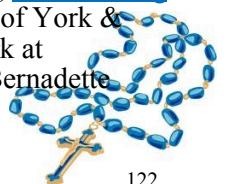

Monthly to shut-ins by the priests. Weekly - Extraordinary Ministers if requested. In an Emergency a Priest Should Be Called Immediately.
