# Second Sunday

On this Second Sunday of Advent our focus begins to shift from the end of time to the time immediately before the first coming of Christ into the world. Yet the message is still the same: God's reign is at hand. The First Reading from the Prophet Isaiah described the peaceable kingdom of God, the day of the Messiah of the Lord. In this kingdom ancient discords are ended, and enemies live as neighbors. The ongoing message from the last several weeks come into play as well, that we live as to make ourselves ready for the Kingdom of God, present and promised. As we begin this week, let us heed Saint John the Baptist, whose message of preparing those people of Israel so long ago, and allow the message to echo in our hearts, "Prepare the way of the Lord, make straight his paths."

*This coming Thursday is the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception, a Holy Day of Obligation. Masses will be celebrated in church at 7AM, 9AM, 12Noon and 7PM.*

Please use them as the needed reference for especially for the Gloria and the Creed.

A few weeks ago I reported on the status of the Thanksgiving Raffle with a profit for the parish of a little over \$9,000.00. This was a few thousand less than the previous year. However, when I was presented with the final report I was pleased to see that we profited over \$13,000.00, several thousand MORE than the previous year! THANK YOU to all who participated in this year's raffle and congratulations to all of our winners!

As announced, we will have our communal confessions on Monday, December 12th at 7PM. We have sixteen priests scheduled to hear confessions that evening. There will be no prayer service prior to confessions. In this bulletin there is an Examination of Conscience to assist you in preparing to make a good and worthy confession. Please take the time prior to coming to church that evening, to begin meditating on what you wish to bring to the Lord in this great sacrament of mercy. Please invite others to this sacrament as well. It is the ideal time to heed the Baptist's call – prepare the way of the Lord!

In the secular press you may have recently read about the Holy Father giving universal permission for priests to absolve from the sin of abortion when confessed in the sacrament of Penance. This has caused some confusion and misunderstanding. This permission is not new. Priests in the Archdiocese of Philadelphia have had permission of the archbishop for many years to pastorally care for those who confess this sin. In my 36 years as a priest, I have never had to have recourse to the archbishop before absolving someone of the sin of abortion. The Holy Father, in his statement, was trying to once again underscore the limitless mercy of God. For this mercy we should give daily thanks and praise.

May this week be filled with the graces needed to prepare for a good confession and the coming of the Lord in mercy!





Reconciliation (also known as confession or Penance) is a sacrament instituted by Jesus Christ in his love and mercy to offer sinners forgiveness for offenses committed against God. At the same time, sinners reconcile with the Church, because it is also wounded by our sins.

# The Sacrament of Reconciliation **RITE OF RECONCILIATION:**

Priest gives a blessing or greeting.

- Make the Sign of the Cross and say, "Bless me, father, for I have sinned. My last confession was [give weeks, months, or years]."
- Confess all of your sins to the priest. (If you are unsure or uneasy, tell him and ask for help.) Say, "I am sorry for these and all of my sins." The priest assigns a penance and offers advice to help you be a better Catholic.
- Say an Act of Contrition, expressing your sorrow for your sins. The priest, acting in the person of Christ, then absolves you from your sins.

### ACT OF CONTRITION:

0 my God. I am heartily sorry for having offended you, and I detest all my sins because of *your just punishments;* but most of all because they offend you,



mv God. who are all good and deserving of all my love

*I firmly resolve with* the help of your grace to sin no more and avoid the near occasion of sin. Amen.

Every time we sin, we hurt ourselves, other people, and God. In Reconciliation, we acknowledge our sins before God and his Church. We express our sorrow in a meaningful way, receive the forgiveness of Christ and his Church, make reparation for what we have done, and resolve to do better in the future.

To make a good confession we review our lives since our last confession, searching our thoughts, words, and actions for that which did not conform to God's command to love him and one another through his laws and the laws of his Church. This is called an examination of conscience.

### **EXAMINATION OF CONSCIENCE:**

Recall your sins. Prayerfully ask yourself what you have done with full knowledge and full consent against God's and the Church's commandments.

- Do I cling to my will, my desires, my ways? Have I thanked God for his gifts to me?
- Have I reverence for the name of Jesus? Am I ashamed to witness to my faith in God to others?
- Did I take the name of God in vain? Did I curse or take • a false oath?
- Did I miss Mass on Sundays or holy days of obligation through my own fault? Am I attentive at Mass? Did I keep fast and abstinence on the prescribed days?
- Did I hate or quarrel with anyone, or desire revenge? Did I refuse to forgive? Was I disrespectful?
- Did I get drunk? Did I take illicit drugs?
- Did I consent to, recommend, advise, or actively take part in an abortion?
- Was I unfaithful to my spouse? Did I engage in sexual activity outside of marriage?
- Did I steal or damage another's property? Have I been honest and just in my business relations?
- Have I been responsive to the needs of the poor and re -spected the dignity of others? Did I tell lies? Did I judge others rashly in serious matters?
- Have I envied other people?
- Am I able to forgive myself? Do I seek to be humble and to bring peace?
