# The Second Sunday

Since today is the Second Sunday in Ordinary Time, last Sunday must have been the first. We did not realize it because it was also the feast of the Baptism of the Lord. Through baptism, we each became members of the Body of Christ, the Church. It may seem guite "ordinary," but it certainly is not, as our baptism was the occasion of our rebirth in the Spirit. Today's readings from scripture narrated for us a number of awesome events. Ancient Jerusalem has been restored to prominence, early Christians are healing others and speaking in tongues, and in the Gospel Jesus is changing water to wine at the wedding feast in Cana. Here he inaugurates his ministry. All of these things are attributed to God: God the Father, Son and Holy Spirit. As we celebrate Ordinary Time today, may we recognize the extraordinariness of God's grace and recognize the power that this gift gives to all of us!

Of Ordinary Time In light of this week's Gospel of the wedding feast of Cana, I want to call your attention to the topic of the Sacrament of Matrimony. Last weekend, in our bulletin, there was the first installment in a series of topics on this great sacrament of love. We are indebted to Deacon George who wrote these teachings for the bulletin. We as a staff have been attending REMAIN IN MY LOVE workshops and meetings to discern how best to keep this sacrament in the forefront and to support the married couples in our local community. We have begun to develop some strategies and we would like your input as well. If you, as a married couple, think there are some practical ways to support and enhance married life, we would love to hear from you! Father Biedrzycki has been leading the staff discussions on this topic. If you have a thought, please contact Father and he can bring your thoughts to further our staff discussions going forward. Thank you for considering my request!

In this week's look at Marriage, Old Testament Part 1 God's intent from the beginning was for monogamy. "... This one is bone of my bone and flesh of my

flesh" (Genesis 2:22-24) Man and woman are united in the Covenant of Marriage.

The essentials of a Covenant in the Old Testament are:

- -free choice
- it is rational, not a contact .. for this task a payment is rendered
- -based on love
- -intended to be permanent
- -requires fidelity of both parties
- -includes promises
- -it is ratified in ritual
- -it is associated with a shrine or holy place

For centuries, women were always under the authority and protection of a man, with the possible exception of older women who outlive their husbands. This is initially their father and eventually their husband. We hear this down to



modern times when in the wedding ceremony the question was asked at the very beginning "Who gives this woman to be married?" It was the reason that the father always escorted his daughter to the altar to be married.

The wife was subordinate to her husband. The Mosaic law discouraged having more than one wife, restricted divorce and aimed to enforce purity of life. The abuse of divorce continued unabated.

If you read the stories of Gideon, Elkanah, Samuel, Oueen Esther, David, Solomon you will find that polygamy was an unmitigated sociological disaster that created heartbreak and sowed familial discord.
