

The Epiphany

Word traveled quickly! What had originally been known only to Mary, then to Joseph, and soon shared with intimate friends like Mary's cousin Elizabeth, was revealed to the shepherds on the night of Jesus' birth, and now to foreigners – the magi from the east. Jesus, the Messiah, the Son of God, the Savior, has been born! Let us rejoice on this feast of the Epiphany of the Lord and make manifest through our lives His saving presence and life-giving grace!

On this day of gifts I wish to thank the Louis Swift Plunkett Funeral Home for providing once again the beautiful religious calendars for our homes for 2020. Not only do these calendars mark the passing of time but offer us reflections of our faith each month. For this gift, thank you!

I know they would not want public recognition but on behalf of our parish I want to express deep gratitude to Kathy and Mike Thornton for their generous donation of the new garland that surrounds our church this Christmas season. The garland that had been used even before my arrival 15 years ago finally was showing its age and every year more and more strands of lights were failing. This donation will beautify our church for many years to come. Thank you Kathy and Mike!

Also, while the supply lasts, please help yourself to the latest Matthew Kelly book Rediscover the Saints. This book is provided free of charge to our parish families. When you finish reading it, consider passing it along to family members and friends so that they may read it and hopefully grow in their faith. It is an easy way to evangelize without too much discomfort.

It has come to my attention, through Deacon George, that the number of altar servers is diminishing. This is a cause for some concern but it also opens an opportunity for additional service to the parish. I am inviting any adults in the community who may wish to serve at the altar to please call the parish office and leave your name and number. There will be a training session or two to assist in this ministry. I am particularly interested in adults who may be available during the week to serve at funeral Masses. We have students who are available but I want to supplement their service especially when we have multiple funerals in the same week. PLEASE consider this ministry to assist at the altar of the Lord, for it is a great privilege and a source of great blessings!

Since we are beginning a new year, I want to offer a suggestion for a New Year's resolution. It has to do with people who leave church early, and ESPECIALLY those who leave by the emergency doors by the prayer garden. If you have to leave early and you use those doors, please leave quietly! Those doors slam shut and it makes a lot of noise. It is extremely distracting, especially at the 7AM Mass, when there is no music to remotely muffle the sound! I am not judging anyone who MUST leave early for a legitimate reason or purpose (being the first one out of the parking lot is not a good reason), but I am asking you to consider why you are leaving early and how you leave. Just remember, there is no early leaving the Lord in heaven, we will have Him for eternity! So, what's the rush here? Where are you going? Does five minutes really make all that much difference?

One of the most anxious experiences for parents is when their son or daughter get a driver's permit or driver's license. I think we might all agree that driving is a very hazardous and dangerous necessity, even for the most seasoned driver. In order to help alleviate parental anxiety, on the third Sunday of each month, at the 11AM Mass, after the Prayer of the Faithful, we will have a blessing of new drivers. Also at the same time we will present each new driver with a keychain with a Saint Christopher medal on one side and a Saint Jude medal on the other. We can all use some divine protection through the intercession of these two great saints. If you are interested in this blessing, please contact the parish office so we will be prepared for the blessing. Many thanks!

May the Feast of the Epiphany of the Lord focus our attention and prayer on the many gifts that we have received from the Lord and to treasure the gift of grace that we receive each day!

THE EPIPHANY OF OUR LORD

Isaiah 60:1-6; Ephesians 3:2-3a,5-6; Matthew 2:1-12



The Manifestation of Our God

The Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord embodies a rich liturgical tradition, originating in the earliest Christian centuries. In the Eastern Churches, this day occupies an even greater prominence than Christmas. Rome

has assimilated it into the Christmas season where too often the faithful understand it to be only a commemoration of the visit of the Magi to the newborn Christ.

The account of the Magi is indeed a rich and beautiful story that shows well the virtues—and perils—of seeking Christ. However, this Solemnity reveals so much more to us! Taken together, the Gospel accounts of the Magi, the baptism of Jesus in the Jordan, and his first sign (or miracle) at the wedding feast at Cana, draw our attention to the depth of God's profound saving love for us in Christ, a love which extends to the ends of the Earth!

At we enter the new year, what gift do you bring to the Lord? How will this gift bring others closer to Jesus?

Almighty Father, you revealed Jesus as the light of the nations, the eternal Word made flesh.

Bathe us in his light and draw us beyond our human limits into the completeness of your life.

COMING THIS LENT —

We often hear about Jesus' passion and death, but imagine experiencing them for the very first time. In the video series: No Greater Love: A Biblical Walk Through Christ's Passion. Filmed on location in the Holy Land, this is a five part series that reveals Christ's amazing love for us. PARISH REGISTRATION

Welcome new parishioners! Please ask one of the priests after a weekend Mass to register your family. Please notify the parish office if you are moving from the parish or if you have changed your address. Also, Children who turn 26 years of age, or have completed higher education and continue to reside with in our area, should become individually registered parishioners.

SAFE ENVIRONMENT PROGRAM

All parish staff and volunteers who have regular contact with young people must have their background checks and training to volunteer with our youth.
